Six assignments are for compulsory papers (MRR-101, MRR-102, MRR-103, MRR-104, MRR-005 and MRR-006) and one assignment for optional papers (MRRE-007, MRRE-008, MRRE-009 and MRRE-010). Please remember that you will appear in the term-end examination of the same optional paper (out of the four given above) for which you have attempted the assignment.

Before you attempt the assignments, please read the instructions carefully provided in the Programme Guide. It is important you write the answers to all the TMA questions in your own words. Your answers should be within the approximate range of the word-limit set for each question. Remember, writing answers to assignment questions will improve your writing skills and prepare you for the term-end examination.
