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## **1.0 ABOUT THE PROGRAMME**

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### **1.1 Introduction**

Environmental and Occupational Health focuses on assessing the public health risks associated with biological, chemical, physical, biomechanical and psychosocial hazards in natural and built environments. Environmental health specialists focus on the effect of environmental pollution on the health of human beings. The human health is a reflection of socio-economic & physical environment. The main link between the workplace and the general environment is that the source of the hazard is usually the same, whether it is an agriculture activity or an industrial activity. The programme aims at various concepts related to general environment, environment at the work place, related hazards and evaluation of health risk assessment by providing solutions to various aspects of environmental health occupational hazard management, epidemiology, health policy and management, and environmental health promotion. The successful learners will be able to work with health practitioners, researchers and policy makers to develop, evaluate and monitor health policies, programmes and practices related to healthy environments.

As per the secondary data available there is an urgent need for competent professionals in this field.

The detrimental effects on human health or on the environment caused by new types and patterns of hazards, exposures and risks due to liberalization of world trade, rapid technological progress, significant developments in transport and communication, shifting patterns of employment, changes in work organization practices, the different employment patterns of men and women, and the size, structure and life cycles of enterprises and of new technologies. Impaired health and environmental degradation lower human productivity. The economic burden can be expressed not only in costs of treatment, but also in quantifying the loss of productivity. On the other hand, healthy workers increase industrial output and lower the cost of production and through their incomes they can contribute to the health of their families and their communities. Environmental and occupational health professionals improve public health by focusing all their efforts on identifying and addressing these environmental risk factors. This is fairly a new discipline and area of study. Some of the main responsibilities of environmental and occupational health professional include to:

- Develop strategies to prevent hazards to workers, property, environment and the general public.
- Measure hazards at worksites.
- Enforcing central, state and local regarding food/water sanitation. Hazardous/infectious waste handling and cleanliness/safety in all environments.
- Collecting and analyzing environmental samples to test for hazards and dispensing information regarding disease outbreaks.

### **1.2 Programme Offer and Coverage**

MAEOH will be offered in both January and July session every year. It is offered throughout the country through the established network of IGNOU Regional Centres.

### **1.3 Programme Objectives**

### **8.3 Target Population**

Applicants must possess graduation from any discipline and a strong inclination and desire to build a career in Environmental and Occupational health and should also have an interest in issues related to public health and the environment. The admission criteria will be followed as per IGNOU norms.

### **1.9 Prospects**



After successful completion of this diploma program, students find employment opportunities in various industries/institutions/organizations as risk assessors, occupational health specialists and food safety experts and in private sectors as environmental consultants, occupational health professional, national public health agencies, and environmental institutes/agencies. Further opportunities are also there in environmental health-related agency of the government, such as the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Food and Drug Administration (FDA), local health agencies, environmental consulting firms, private industry, non-governmental organizations, hospitals, health care organization, labour organizations, universities and college. 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## 3.0 INSTRUCTIONAL SYSTEM

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The instructional system of IGNOU is learner-oriented and learner-centered. In this system, the learner is an active participant in the teaching-learning process. Most of the instruction is imparted through distance modes of communication rather than face-to-face modes of communication. The University follows a multi-media approach for instruction. So, the instructional system of MAEOH also follows multi-media approach i.e. self-instructional print material, audio-video programmes, assignments, face-to-face counselling sessions, project work, teleconferencing and interactive radio counselling, among others.

### 3.1 Self-instructional Print Material

The print material is written in self-instructional style. It is in the form of blocks (booklets) specially prepared for theory courses and project work of the programme. Each course has a specific code number assigned to it. They are supplied to each learner along with a set of assignment questions. The learner has to complete the required assignments related to each course. Each course may have 3-4 blocks and each block may have 3-4 units. The printed material for project work is available in the form of booklet with all guidelines.

### 3.2 Audio-video Programmes

The learning package also contains audio-video programmes which are produced by the University for clarification, supplementing and enhancement of understanding of the course material given to the student. These programmes are normally of 25-30 minutes duration. These are used at the Study Centres during counselling sessions which are duly scheduled and notified by the Programme In-charge/Co-ordinator of Study Centre for the benefit of the students. The video programmes are also telecast on *Gyan Darshan*, National Network and enrichment channel of Doordarshan. Similarly, the audio programmes when produced are also broadcast by *Gyan Vani* and selected stations of All India Radio. Learners can contact Study Centres for further information.

### 3.3 Assignments

Assignments are an integral and compulsory component of the instructional system. There is one tutor-marked assignment for each theory course. Students will have to work on these assignments. Each student should submit the assignment responses to the Coordinator/ Programme In-charge of the Study Centre in accordance with the given assignments' submission schedule. **Students can download the assignments from IGNOU website ([www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)) at student's zone or at SOITS webpage.**

### 3.4 Counselling Sessions

**Qualification of the Academic Counsellors:**

1. Faculty from Head Quarters
2. Candidates with Ph.D / M.Sc/MA with 2 years of experience in relevant discipline/ MD in relevant discipline/areas. Relevant discipline includes Botany/Zoology, Physics/Chemistry/Bio-chemistry/microbiology/Biotechnology/Life

science/genetics/engineering in any specialization, medical in all specializations and paramedical, Gender and Development, Sociology, Geology, Geography, Extension and Development Studies.

Upto six counselling sessions per course are held at the Study Centres as per the schedule drawn and notified by the Coordinator/Programme In-charge of the concerned Centre. They are mostly held on weekends (i.e. Saturdays and Sundays) as per the convenience of the host institution where the Study Centre is located. However, if the number of students for the programme at a programme study centre falls below 10 (ten), then the counselling and support services may be handled by a Distance Learning Facilitator or the programme coordinator or the faculty of the School concerned or through an appropriate alternative arrangement.

### **3.5 Teleconferencing**

Teleconferencing sessions are conducted via satellite through interactive *Gyan Darshan* Channel from the University studios as per the schedule made available to the Regional and Study Centres. Teleconferencing is an effective means of interaction between the learners, experts and others concerned with the programme. It provides an interesting opportunity to the students to interact with the faculty members at the headquarters, and other experts/ eminent scholars in the field. The learners will have to go to the nearest reception centre at the scheduled time for taking the benefit of this facility.

### **3.6 Interactive Radio Counselling**

Interactive Radio Counselling is a recent concept in distance learning in India. Live counselling is provided on radio by invited experts for an hour from different radio stations in the country. Students can ask questions right from their homes through telephone by availing the facility of toll-free telephone number 1600112345 provided for this purpose from selected cities.

### **3.7 Project Work**

The handbook on Project Work provides self-orientation and self-training to the students for doing the project work. **All the project proposals are to be submitted at their respective Regional Centers/LSC's.**

The completed project report is to be submitted to the Student Evaluation Division.

Please see the 'MEVP -001 Project Handbook' for guidelines to prepare and submit the project proposal as well as project report.

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The MAEOH programme is delivered as a continuous programme of one year duration starting from the beginning of the relevant academic session. 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## 5.0 EVALUATION

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**Theory Courses:** For theory courses, evaluation comprises three aspects:

- a) Self-evaluation checks your progress exercises (non-credit) within each unit of study material.
- b) Continuous evaluation in the form of compulsory one assignment for each course with a weightage of 30%.
- c) Term-End Examination for each course with a weightage of 70%.

In order to successfully complete a theory course, the student must obtain at least `40%' in the assignment and `40%' in the Term-End Examination (TEE) separately in each course.

**Project Work:** The evaluation report of Project Work will carry 70% weightage for report and 30% on viva. In order to successfully complete the project work, the student must obtain at least `40%'.

The grading system depending on the percentage of marks secured by the candidates in TEE and evaluation report for Project Work will be as follows.

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## **6.0 ASSIGNMENTS**

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The purpose to work on the assignments is to provide you an opportunity of articulating your assimilated knowledge and understanding into written form and also to test your capacity of transferring the theoretical learning from the courses to practical situations. Thus, the assignments practically enhance your understanding as well as skills of articulation and expression in writing. There is one assignment for each theory course. The answers to assignment questions are to be based on your own judgement and experiences as a student. You should not reproduce the text materials or copy the information from other sources. However, you may use the course material and any other sources of information you have for ready reference. But, the answer should be in your own words and should reflect your own ideas. Please note that your assignment responses carry 30% weightage towards the final evaluation of each theory course. If you do not complete the assignments according to time schedule of assignments of the relevant academic session, then you must attempt the assignment questions of the next session and submit the assignment responses according to the schedule of that session. You must send the assignment-responses to the Study Centre you are attached to as per schedule. The instructions given in the assignments should be kept in mind while you prepare and submit the assignment responses.

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## 7.0 TERM-END EXAMINATION (TEE)

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The TEE is another component of the evaluation system with 70% weightage for each theory course. The University conducts term-end examination (TEE) twice a year i.e. in June and in December of every year. In case you fail to get a pass score (less than 50%) in the TEE, you will be eligible to re-appear in the next TEE for that course, till the final span of the programme i. e. prior to completion by you of the maximum duration of four years from the date of your admission / registration to the programme.

Examination date-sheets (schedule which indicate the date and time of examination for each course) are sent to all the study centres and the same is also notified through the IGNOU website.

It is a pre-requisite to submit the Examination Form with a fee of Rs.120/- (revised from time to time) per course in the form of demand draft drawn in favour of IGNOU and payable at New Delhi or at the city where the concerned Regional Centre to which you are submitting your form is located (Copy of the examination form is given in Annexure-IV). They are also available at Study Centres, Regional Centres, and Student Evaluation Division at the Headquarters at New Delhi. The form can also be downloaded from IGNOU website: [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in). Only one form is to be submitted for all the courses you are appearing in TEE.

- Normally your Study Centre is the Examination Centre. In case you wish to take examination at a particular centre, the code of your chosen centre is to be filled up as Examination Centre Code. However, if Examination Centre chosen by you is not activated, you will be allotted to any other Examination Centre under the same Region.
- Change of Examination Centre, once allotted, is not permissible under any circumstances.

The filled-in examination form is to be submitted to the concerned Regional Centre under which your examination centre falls. The dates for submission of Examination Forms are given below. (\*Subject to the revision by the IGNOU rules)
