National Workshop On Reclaiming Research in Livestock Development through Policy Interventions (26-27, April 2011)

ver the years, research has generated a vast number of outputs aimed to help the livestock owners realise higher income through increased production, productivity and health care. These outputs in the form of technologies, (relevant) knowledge and (improved) practices – TKP, in short – have been exploited by only a few livestock owners, that too often the resource-rich. The resource-poor livestock smallholders whose livelihoods depend to a substantial extent on the livestock are unable to take advantage of these TKPs for a variety of reasons. One of the important reasons is lack of enabling policy environment and institutional arrangements that would facilitate TKPs delivery, uptake and application. This could be attributed to various reasons like:

- limited awareness of relevant research findings among the policy makers,
- limited influence of research on policy due to the constraints of researchers in communicating the findings, and,
- notion among the researchers that generation of research outputs is the end of their endeavour, rather than socio-economic impact.

Irrespective of the reasons, the result is that good research outputs stand short of application and stimulating necessary policy interventions. Researchers, policy makers and extension professionals very often operate in isolation and the consequence is that the policies are incongruous with the factors influencing the application of TKP. It is very well recognised that the livestock owners will be in a better position to absorb the TKP, if appropriate supportive policy frameworks exist. To cite an example, a policy that all the artificial insemination centres must be open in morning and evening on all the days can increase the coverage and conception rate significantly.

About the Workshop

This workshop provides a platform for all livestock research and development professionals who have sound evidence on TKP to interact and identify appropriate policy support required. This workshop will allow a critical analysis of the TKP packages generated by research to showcase the role of policy in the uptake of these TKPs. The idea is neither to discuss the technologies nor to highlight the constraints, but to focus only on favourable policy interventions that will enhance their uptake.

Expected Outcome

The expected outcome of this exercise is communicating a set of suggested policy and institutional interventions to Planning Commission, Central and State Governments to enhance the delivery and uptake of TKPs that can help livestock development.
