The schools of Indian thoughts are classified as either orthodox or heterodox. There are six major orthodox schools of Indian philosophy: Nyaya, Vaisheshika, Samkhya, Yoga, Mimamsa and Vedanta, and three major heterodox schools: Jain, Buddhist, and Charvaka. They differ in their assumptions about the nature of existence as well as the specifics of the path to the ultimate liberation. | |
