At the commencement of the meeting, Professor Nageshwar Rao, Vice Chancellor of IGNOU and the Chairperson of the Research Council, extended a warm welcome to the newly appointed



members of the Research Council. He introduced each new member briefly. Additionally, Professor Rao expressed his gratitude to the outgoing members of the Research Council, including the external members;Professor R. R. Kanhare, Prof. Rekha Prasad, Prof. Anil Shukla, Prof Sangeeta Jain, Prof SS Sarkar and Prof PR Agrawal and internal members including directors of various Schools such as SOHS, SOGDS, SOEDS, SOCIS and SOTST, Professor Swaraj Basu, Prof. Sunita Malhotra, Dr. Archana Singh, Dr. Anamika Shukla, Dr. Madhulika Sarkar, Dr. Archana Shukla, and Dr. Amit Chaturvedi, for their valuable contributions during their tenure.

In his initial remarks, the Chairperson provided an overview of the PhD admissions for the July 2022 session. He briefed the committee on the Ph.D. program at the University, emphasizing its strict adherence to the UGC Regulations, subject to periodic amendments. He also informed the members about the IGNOU research fellowship, designed to support full-time meritorious scholars who do not receive financial aid from other sources. This fellowship, serves as an incentive for research work and informed the members about the increasing number of candidates pursuing Research Degree Programs at the University, many of whom are beneficiaries of fellowships provided by different funding agencies such as UGC, ICSSR, ICCR, DST, and others.

Thereafter, the Chairperson requested the Director (I/c), Research Unit and Member Secretary of the Research Council to present the agenda items. The Member Secretary presented the agenda items as under:

The Action Taken Report on the **26<sup>th</sup> Research CouncilStanding Committee** was placed before the Council. The Member Secretary informed that no action on the Minutes was pending.

RCThe Research Council confirmed the Minutes of the 26th Research Council32.3.2Standing Committee and noted the Action Taken thereon.

RC 32.4To Consider approval of Exemption from Entrance Test to all those<br/>candidates who qualify for fellowship/scholarship in UGC-NET / UGC- CSIR/<br/>NET/GATE /CEED and similar National level tests based on an interview.

RC The agenda was presented by the Member Secretary in detail. The Member 32.4.1 Secretary informed the members that as per UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for award of Ph D Degree) Regulations as amended from time to time, HEIs may admit students who qualify for fellowship/scholarship in UGC-NET/UGC- CSIR NET/GATE/CEED and similar National level tests based on an interview and/or HEIs may admit students through an Entrance Test conducted at the level of the individual HEI. The Entrance Test syllabus shall consist of 50% of research methodology, and 50% shall be subject-specific. (Annexure 32.4.1)

She further apprised the members that the University had discontinued exemption to these categories since 2019, consequent upon an amendment to the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the award of MPhil/Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2016 wherein the weightage system for Entrance test and interview in the selection process of Ph.D. admission was introduced. IGNOU made Entrance



test compulsory for all irrespective of categories from 2019 onwards. However, the University has provisions in its ordinance for both methods.

Mentioning about an emerging opinion in the University, the Member Secretary said that the University was considering to reintroduce exemption for candidates who qualify for fellowships or scholarships in National-level tests like UGC-NET, UGC-CSIR-NET, GATE, CEED, etc., through interviews for admission to the Ph.D. program. The rationale behind this proposal is to attract qualified and meritorious students who have already demonstrated their academic prowess through these national-level tests.

The Council engaged in a thorough discussion on this matter, and a unanimous consensus emerged. The agreement was that a dual approach, which involves selecting candidates through an Entrance Test while also providing exemptions to those who excel in national-level tests such as UGC-NET, UGC-CSIR-NET, GATE, CEED, and others through interviews, would prove advantageous for the University in attracting highly qualified individuals. Furthermore, in situations where there are vacant seats due to a shortage of qualified applicants via the Entrance Test, Fellowship holders could be considered for admission. The Member Secretary also informed the members that prior to 2019, IGNOU had a practice of granting exemptions to candidates who had successfully passed UGC-NET and similar national-level tests.

RC The Research Council resolved that the University will grant Exemption from
 32.4.2 Entrance Test to all those candidates who qualify for fellowship/scholarship in
 UGC-NET / UGC- CSIR/ NET/GATE /CEED and similar National level tests
 based on an interview and this will be made applicable with immediate effect.



- RC 32.5To Consider approval of Draft PhD Guidelines 2022 in compliance with UGC<br/>(Minimum Standards and Procedure for award of PhD Degree) Regulations,<br/>2022
- RC The agenda was presented by the Member Secretary in detail. The Member 32.5.1 Secretary informed the members that at its 31st Meeting, the Research Council formally adopted the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations 2022. She briefed the members about the IGNOU Research Ordinance and Regulations, which were approved by the President of India in 2019, specifying that the University must offer its Ph.D. programs in compliance with the UGC Regulations, subject to any future amendments. To facilitate the practical aspects of running the University's research Ordinance and Regulations.

She further informed that a committee tasked with harmonizing the University's Ph.D. Guidelines with the updated UGC provisions was constituted by the Honorable Vice Chancellor. (Annexure 32.5) that prepared a draft of the Guidelines, synchronized with the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations for 2022. Once these Guidelines receive approval, they would be referred to as the Ph.D. Guidelines, 2022.

She presented before the members the modifications made to the previous Guidelines, documented in a tabular format highlighting changes, additions, and deletions (<u>Annexure RC 32.5.1</u>) and the final draft Guidelines as they would appear following the incorporation of amendments <u>Annexure 32.5.2</u>.

RC The Committee engaged in a comprehensive discussion regarding the provisions32.5.2 and commended the University for its diligent efforts in establishing a Standard



Operating Procedure for the administration of research programs. However, the Committee put forward a suggestion that the designated Committee, formed for this specific purpose, should revisit the Guidelines meticulously to ensure the prevention of any inadvertent errors.

- RC The Research Council granted approval for the Ph.D. Guidelines 2022, which
  32.5.3 will be put into effect for candidates admitted to the Ph.D. Program from the July
  2022 session and onwards.
- RC 32.6 To Consider exemption from course work for the July 2022 registered students who had completed their course work during MPhil from IGNOU
- RC The agenda was presented by the Member Secretary in detail. The Member
   32.6.1 Secretary informed the members that under the UGC regulations of 2016, research scholars who had successfully completed their coursework during their MPhil were exempted from additional coursework requirements. Accordingly, this exemption was availed by research scholars at IGNOU.

However, consequent upon the issuance of the UGC (Minimum Standards and Procedure for the Award of PhD Degree) Regulations for 2022 which did not include any provision for exempting students from coursework, Given that the coursework structure at IGNOU was the same for both MPhil and Ph.D. programs, the absence of an exemption clause in the UGC Regulations for 2022 had led to numerous queries, especially from candidates admitted to the Ph.D. program for the 2022 session, she mentioned.

Furthermore, the Council provided guidance suggesting that faculty members should periodically review and update the course content to align it with the current needs and requirements. This ongoing revision process will contribute to enhancing the quality of the course material.

**RC** During deliberations, the Research Council emphasized the importance of 32.11.2 exercising caution before recommending the cancellation of a Ph.D. scholar's registration. The Council proposed that communication notifying students of the cancellation of their registration should be sent both through registered post and email to ensure proper notification.

> Additionally, the Research Council reiterated the necessity for a comprehensive examination of all cases of cancellation before issuing the final notification to the student. Furthermore, it stressed that the actions taken in this regard should be included in the agenda submitted to RC/RCSC for decision-making. She further presented the recommendations of Admission Monitoring Committee <u>Annexed at 32.14</u> which recommended the projected seats and modalities to be adopted for the admission to the PhD programme for July 2023 session.

Taking note of the disciplines and the projected seat numbers, the Research Council made an observation that disciplines that do not offer a Master's program should also refrain from offering a Ph.D. program. Additionally, the Council expressed the

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opinion that disciplines should exercise caution when projecting the number of vacant seats for advertising Ph.D. program admissions. This caution should be exercised in consideration of the available resources and time, with the primary goal being to ensure the quality of the Ph.D. programme.
