

At the outset, Prof. Ruchika Kuba, Director, SOHS welcomed all the Members of the School Board to the 75th School Board Meeting. She congratulated the new members Prof. Anita Priyadarshini, Professor, STRIDE, IGNOU, New Delhi, Prof. Arbind Kumar Jha, Professor,







SOE, IGNOU, New Delhi, Dr. Anamika Shukla, Associate Professor, SOH, IGNOU, New Delhi and Dr. Mohd. Saleem, Assistant Professor, SOFL, New Delhi on their selection as School Board Members by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. She also put on record the contribution of the outgoing members Prof. Sutapa Bose, Professor, SOE, Prof. Suhas Shetgovekar, Professor, SOSS, Prof. Miridula Rashmi Kindo, Associate Professor, SOH, Prof. Sanjay Gupta, Assistant Professor, SOS. Self introduction of members followed. Thereafter, following agenda items were taken up for discussion:

75.0 To consider and approve the Minutes of 74th Meeting of School Board of School of Health Sciences held on 19th May, 2022

Chairperson presented the Minutes of 74th Meeting of School Board held on 19th May, 2022. As there was no observation, the minutes of 74th School Board were confirmed by the members of the School Board.


75.1 Approval of Learning Outcomes-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) for Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing programme of SOHS

Dr. Laxmi, Programme Coordinator, Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Programme informed the members that Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) had requested to prepare the LOCF document for all the UG and PG degree programmes offered during year 2021-22 and get it approved by the School Board.

It was informed by CIQA that as per the UGC document on National Higher Education Qualification Framework (2022), the LOCF needs to be developed by incorporating the following parameters: Knowledge, Skills, Application of Knowledge and skills, Generic Learning Outcomes, Constitutional, Humanistic, Ethical and moral Values, Employability & Entrepreneurship skill. In this regard the LOCF for Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing programme had been prepared by the Programme Coordinators based on the learning objectives for respective courses. Dr. Laxmi explained that there are six parameters in the format and already approved learning objectives have been placed accordingly under each parameter as per format provided and LOCF document prepared (Appendix 1).

Members of the School Board gave suggestions to be included on the topics under the relevant parameters like emerging and infectious diseases, research methodology, sustainable development goals etc. The Programme Coordinators assured the members that the same will be incorporated and the edited document circulated with the minutes as Appendix.

School Board Members of School of Health Sciences approved the LOCF document for Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Programme of SOHS as per the parameters provided by CIQA for the NAAC. The final LOCF document after incorporating the changes as suggested is placed in Appendix 1.







75.2 Approval of Strategy for Term-end Practical Examination for Programme of Skill Training Cell


Prof. T.K. Jena, Project Director, Skill Training Cell informed the members of the School Board that Skill Training Cell is offering four certificate programmes as a part of MoU signed with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW). The programmes are: 1) Certificate in General Duty Assistance (CGDA) 2) Certificate in Geriatric Care Assistance (CGCA) 3) Certificate in Phlebotomy Assistance (CPHA) 4) Certificate in Home Health Assistance (CHHA). Each of the four programmes has one practical course. As per original design, the term-end practical examination is held in the study centres with the help of one internal and one external examiner. This practice is being followed in the centres where there is enough enrollment (at least 10). However, due to low enrollment across the country, substantial number of students are finding it difficult to physically travel and complete all the programme related activities. During COVID time, it was experimented to streamline the practical activities by attaching the students to Skill Development Centres (hospitals having at least 30 beds) where they completed all the essential hands on training component. However, the term-end practical examination pattern was not changed. Most of the regional centres are having 1-2 students who are eligible for term end practical examination. Therefore, there is a need to modify the term-end practical examination process for the regional centres / study centres where the number of eligible students will be less than ten.

Prof. T.K. Jena, Project Director, Skill Training Cell proposed to have the term-end practical examination conducted regional centre-wise/ state-wise in which each examination centre will have one internal examiner from LSC/SDC located in that state/RC and one faculty from School of Health Sciences as external examiner through online link. The internal examiner will take practical examination in coordination with the external examiner who will be available online for evaluating the examination related activities. Examination of multiple regional centres could also be planned in a single day having one internal examiner in each of the centres and one to two external examiners from SOHS depending upon the number of students and feasibility of conducting the examination in a single day.

School Board Members of School of Health Sciences after deliberations approved the strategy for Term-end Practical Examination for Programmes of Skill Training Cell.

75.3 Approval of PRF Form of PGCMDM Programme

Prof. Ruchika Kuba, Director, SOHS and Programme Coordinator informed the members that PG Certificate in Medical Management of CBRNE Disasters







(PGCMDM) programme for MBBS graduates with Indian citizenship, through ODL mode was launched from July 2020. The programme is first of its kind in the country. Monitoring and Feedback from the various stakeholders (students, experts, course writers and editors, programme in charges and counsellors, Regional Directors etc) was undertaken wherein it was proposed that modifications are required in the course content of the practical course MMEL 013. A revision of the course MMEL 013 was decided based on the recommendation of the 6th Core group meeting and suggestions recorded in the monitoring report. Subsequently, the Programme Revision Form (PRF) for PGCMDM Programme was prepared and placed in the 74th meeting of the School Board held on 19th May 2022 for approval. The same was approved. Copy of minutes of the 74th School Board meeting were placed before the School Board as **Appendix 1**.

Prof. Ruchika Kuba, Director, SOHS and Programme Coordinator also informed that an Expert Committee Meeting was held on 17th August 2022 to draw out a detailed syllabus for the MMEL 013 course. The Minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting along with the revised syllabus were placed before the School Board as **Appendix 2**. She further informed that since it was felt that a component of the medical management at site and the hospital need to be included in the syllabus, and in light of the NEP 2020, the credit for the MMEL 013 was increased from 6 to 10, thus increasing the total credit load of the PGCMDM programme to 20. Since these changes warrant a major revision, the PRF form has been revised and placed before the School Board as Appendix 3 for approval.

Members of the School Board of School of Health Sciences approved the revised PRF Form of PGCMDM Programme along with the revised syllabus for MMEL 013.

75.4 Ratification of the approval for implementing the Post Basic B.Sc. (Nursing) programme with enhanced credits after integration of Certificate in Community Health (CCH) Programme from Jan 2023 session onwards

Dr. Laxmi, Programme Coordinator informed the members of the School Board that Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing (Three years degree) Programme of SOHS is being offered since year 1994 and Certificate in Community Health (CCH) programme since January 2017 in collaboration with National Health Mission, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, GOI.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare GOI and Indian Nursing Council (INC) have integrated/included IGNOU's CCH programme in the final year of B.Sc. (Nursing) and in Post Basic B.Sc. (Nursing) Programmes of conventional system from session 2020-2021 and the candidates who complete the B.Sc. (Nursing) and Post Basic B.Sc. (Nursing) Programme from conventional system after 2020, are eligible for

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appointment as a Community Health Officer in Health and Wellness Centres across the country.

To align the Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing programme of IGNOU with the Programme of conventional system, it was planned to integrate CCH programme in Post Basic B.Sc. (Nursing) programme of IGNOU also so that the IGNOU students can get an opportunity to be appointed as Community Health Officers. Permission for integration was granted by INC (Indian Nursing Council). The integration of CCH into Post Basic BSc. Nursing programme was also approved in 74th School Board meeting of SOHS held on 19th May, 2022 as agenda item 74.3 and subsequently in 57th ACSC for adoption of 4 credits in BNSL 209 course of Post Basic BSc Nursing as item no. 15.

After due approvals, the revision of BSNL 209 course by integrating CCH was started. As a result of the integration the credit weightage of BNSL 209 course has increased and number of credits of the Post Basic BSc Nursing programme has enhanced from 108 to 112.

The above agenda related to approval of offering revised course BNSL 209 after enhanced credit was planned to be placed in forthcoming school board of SOHS scheduled on 25/11/2022. After the necessary approvals from the competent bodies /Authorities the updated information was to be placed in the student handbook and prospectus for January 2023 session.


However, mail had been received from SED to urgently provide a prospectus of B.Sc. (N) PB so that application forms may be opened. In light of this, the Agenda item was placed for consideration to competent authority and approved by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor.

Ratification of the approval for implementing the Post Basic B.Sc (Nursing) Programme with enhanced credits after integration of Certificate in Community Health (CCH) Programme from Jan 2023 session onwards was placed before the Members of the School Board for approval.

The Members of the School Board approved the Ratification of the approval for implementing the Post Basic BSc (Nursing) Programme with enhanced credits after integration of Certificate in Community Health (CCH) Programme from Jan 2023 session.

75.5 Approval of Shifting of January 2022 session of Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing to July 2022.

Programme coordinator informed that the admission for January 2022 session for Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing was announced through "Student handbook and prospectus 2022".







The entrance examination was conducted on 8th May, 2022 (OPENNET-X) and the result was declared on 23rd June, 2022. There were 22 approved PSC's for the January 2022 admission for which students had given options for admission.


However, communication was received from PIC, PSC 0723 (P) (RAK College of Nursing) under RC Delhi -1, vide email dated 29.07.2022 regarding withholding of the student support services being provided to all enrolled students till a new MOU is signed between MoHFW and IGNOU. As a result, the whole admission process was put on hold since first week of August, 2022. Subsequently, a committee for Admission and Counseling of Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing programme January 2022 Session was constituted with approval of Honorable Vice Chancellor, IGNOU to decide upon the matters related to admission and counselling process. As per recommendations of the committee, the students qualified under RC Delhi – 1 were contacted to give option of another PSC out of available 21 PSC's and revised merit list of the 21 available PSCs was prepared for all Regional Centers to finalize the admission and declaration of the allotment. This further delayed the process of admission.

With reference to above details the process of admission is being delayed inordinately therefore, it is proposed that the session of January 2022 of Post Basic B.Sc. N to be shifted to July 2022 session. This is to inform that it will be one batch one time modifications only for January 2022 batch admission. Keeping in view the minimum duration (3 years) and maximum (6 years) modified details are given in the following table:

The member of School Board approved the Shifting of January 2022 session of Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing to July 2022 session.







75.6 Approval of Renewal of MOU with DGHS MOHFW for training health functionaries in Biomedical Waste Management

Prof. Ruchika Kuba, Director, SOHS and Programme Coordinator informed the members of School Board that an MOU was signed between IGNOU and DGHS MoHFW for training health functionaries in Biomedical Waste Management, on 10th April 2018 for a period of 5 years. Copy of MOU was placed before the School Board Members.

She also informed that DGHS MoHFW had planned to train 150 of the master trainer's through the Certificate in Health Care Waste Management (CHCWM) programme for which an amount of Rs. 5,13,000 has been given to IGNOU. However, only 61 master trainer's have enrolled in the Programme. Hence, DGHS, MoHFW desires to extend the MOU for a further period of 5 years from the date of termination of the MOU, so that the remaining master trainer's can be trained.

The form of the renewal of MOU between IGNOU and DGHS, MoHFW was placed before the members of School Board for approval.

After discussion, Members of the School Board approved the form of the renewal of MOU between IGNOU and DGHS, MoHFW.


75.7 Approval of Evaluation Methodology of revised PGDGM Programme

Prof. Ruchika Kuba, Director SOHS and Programme Coordinator informed the members of School Board that Post Graduate Diploma in Geriatric Medicine programme has been on offer from 2004. The programme has been revised and the revised programme on offer from 2018. The Evaluation Methodology proposed for the revised programme in the prescribed format received from SED was placed before the members of the School Board for approval.

After discussion, Members of the School Board approved the Evaluation Methodology revised PGDGM Programme.

- 75.8 A. Approval of minutes of Doctoral Research Committee meetings held on 27th July, 2022
- a) To consider and approve conversion of status from full time to part time research scholar of Ms. Chandani Thakur, Enrolment no. 202493728

Dr. Reeta Devi Research programme coordinator informed that Ms. Chandani Thakur, Enrolment no. 202493728 was granted full time PhD at the time of Ph.D registration. However, subsequently Ms. Chandani Thakur accepted a regular job and requested that her status to be converted to part time PhD instead of full time. DRC members recommended for the conversion of status from full time to Part time research scholar.







Members deliberated and approved on the agenda for conversion of status from full time to regular part time research scholar of Ms. Chandani Thakur, Enrolment no. 202493728.

b) To consider and approve the Research Programme Coordinator and Cocoordinator

After superannuation of Prof. Pity Koul, the charge of PhD. in Nursing programme was handed over to Dr. Reeta Devi. DRC members recommended the names of Dr. Reeta Devi as the PhD Programme Coordinator and Dr. Neerja Sood as PhD Cocoordinator and suggested the names to be reviewed after 1 year.

Members approved the name of Dr. Reeta Devi as the Research Programme Coordinator and Dr. Neerja Sood as Co-coordinator.

c) Reporting of decision of DRC on the Pre-submission seminar of PhD Nursing scholar Mr. N. Sabari Vel (Enrolment No. 188500521)


Dr. Reeta Devi Research programme coordinator reported that Mr. N. Sabari Vel Enrolment Number 188500521 Ph.D nursing scholar's Pre-Submission Seminar presentation. She said that it was observed that there was a need to clarify research methodology in depth, hence, after deliberations by the Doctoral Committee Members he was instructed for re-submission of Pre-submission Seminar.

d) Progress Report and Progress Report Presentation by two Ph.D. in nursing scholars.

Dr. Reeta Devi Research programme coordinator reported that Mrs. Lakra Alma Juliet Francis Enrolment No. 188500539 could not attend previous two DRC meetings held for progress report presentation on 25th January 2022 due to hospitalization same had been communicated by her via email. The subsequent DRC held on 27th July, 2022 was also not attended by her and she cited the reason being she was out of India and could not get the visa to return on her email communication. However, she had sent both progress reports in e-mail. But there was no significant progress related to research work observed in there progress report.

The second scholar Ms. Ponnamma K M enrolment no. 188500514 also could not attend DRC held on 27th July, 2022 as she reported in the e-mail that she had Post Covid health issues.

Dr. Reeta Devi placed on record about the absence during progress report which would be further brought to the notice of Research Unit/RC.

- a) Approval of Research Topics and allotment of Research Supervisors to three Ph.D in Nursing scholars of July 2020 batch

Dr. Reeta Devi, Research Programme Coordinator informed that the Doctoral Committee meeting was held on 9th November, 2022 to finalize the Research Topics of three Ph.D in Nursing scholars and to allot Research Supervisors.

The scholar made in-depth presentations followed by deliberations on the topics, hence, Research Topics of three scholars finalised in DRC were placed for approval of members of School Board. After deliberations by members of school board suggested minor modifications on the topics as per details given below and allotment of Research Supervisors:

Members of School Board of SOHS discussed in details and approved Research Topics with minor modifications to three Ph.D in nursing scholars of July 2020 batch and Research Supervisors allotted to them.

b) To consider and approve the constitutions of ethical committee as per ICMR Guidelines.

Dr. Neerja Sood, reported that currently there is no sub-committee at SOHS for the approval of PhD scholar's research proposals therefore scholars face problems to get ethical clearance and publications of research papers in future, As per ICMR guidelines it is mandatory to get ethical approval before initiating a study involving human participants keeping this in view note was moved through proper channel to Research Unit, IGNOU for the constitution of ethical committee (Sub-Committee). Research Unit suggested to take approval of the Doctoral Research Committee (Nursing) followed by the approval of the School Board of SOHS for the constitution of ethical Sub-Committee for the ethical clearance of research proposals (as per ICMR guidelines) submitted by PhD in Nursing Scholars. DRC on 9th November, 2022, recommended and approved the constitution of on Ethical Sub-Committee as per ICMR.

Dr. Neerja Sood emphasized the need for ethical sub-committee to review research proposals and highlighted the composition of Sub-Committee as per ICMR Guidelines.

As per ICMR guidelines composition of an EC includes:

- Multi-disciplinary and multi-sectoral
- 2. Adequate representation of gender and age
- 3. preferably 50 percent members to be from outside the Institution
- 4. Number of members to be between 7 to 15 and minimum 5 to meet the quorum
- Balance of EC with medical (clinicians with appropriate medical qualification) and non-medical/technical (qualification related to particular branch in which study is conducted) members as per need

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

Note:

- Chairperson and Member Secretary can have a dual role in EC. They could fulfil a
 role based on their qualification (such as that off a clinician, legal expert, basic
 scientist, social scientist lay person etc.) in addition taking up the role of Chairperson
 and Member Secretary.
- EC can have set of alternate members who can be invited as members with decisionmaking powers to meet the quorum requirement. These members have same TORs as regular members and attend meeting in absence of regular members.
- EC can maintain panel of subject experts who are consulted for their subject expertise.
 They may be invited to attend the meeting to give an expert opinion on a specific proposal but not have decision making power.
- 4. EC may invite subject expert as independent consultants or include a representative from a specific patient group as a member of EC or special invitee for a opinion on a specific proposal with appropriate decision-making power.
- 5. EC membership may be for 2-3 years.
- 6. EC members may be given reasonable honorarium to attend the meetings.
- 7. Letters to be issues to all members by Head of the Institution with TORs / Responsibilities, duration, conditions and honorarium etc.







- 8. EC members to be selected as per institution SOPs
- 9. EC members to provide recent CV and experience, sign conflict of interest agreement


After detailed discussion on constitution of Ethical Committee (Sub-Committee) the School Board members strongly recommended and approved the constitution of Ethical Committee (Sub-Committee) as per ICMR guidelines as given above. Final list of internal and external members will be submitted in due time after obtaining consent and CV from the willing members.

75.9 Ratification of approval for enhancement of seats from 60 to 90 as a special case in CCH programme for students admitted in RC Vijayawada and RC Visakhapatnam for the July 2022 session

Dr. Reeta Devi Programme Coordinator for CCH programme informed that RC Vijayawada and RC Visakhapatnam had sent a proposal for enhancement of seats from 60 to 90 in order to accommodate the 1700 candidates in 19 PSCs for the students admitted under their Regional Centres for CCH programme in July 2022 session. This was in response to communication received by State Mission Director, Andhra Pradesh to attach 90 students instead of 60 students (additional strength of 30 students per PSC in both the RCs). They have further clarified that the state of Andhra Pradesh can provide clinical training at the SCs/PHCs/CHCs/ District Hospitals as per required norms for 50 days practical sessions. Regional Directors (Vijayawada and Visakhapatnam) have also ensured of having enough academic counsellors for conducting the theory and practical counselling.

Further to this, concurrence from Director, NHM, MoHFW was obtained vide letter no. Z-28015/42/2020-NRHM-1 dated 12th August, 2022 to the increase seating capacity in each of the 19 PSCs from 60 to 90 students. Since Ministry has to achieve the targets to place Community Health Officers in Health and Wellness Centres across country by December 2022, hence one time approval as special case to enhance the seats from 60 to 90 per PSCs was put up to Competent Authority on urgent basis that admission could be completed within the stipulated time. The agenda was placed for the ratification of approval for enhancement of seats from 60 to 90 in School Board and was approved.

Members deliberated upon the need to enhance the seats and ratified the approval for enhancement of seats from 60 to 90 as one-time special case for students of CCH programme admitted in July 2022 session under RC Vishakhapatnam and RC Vijaywada








75.10 Co-option of External Members for the School Board of SOHS under Clause (2) (e) of Statute of 10 A of the Statues of the University




