#### **REPORT**

The University, true to its name, as "The People's University" stands for utmost respect to human values, rights and constitutional obligations ensuring an inclusive environment recognising cultural, regional, linguistic, communal, socio-economic and such other diversities. The 56 Regional Centres and over 1800 Learner Support Centres help the University in building its national character and come up to the expectations of all the stakeholders. The various activities and initiatives reflecting such character of the University are mentioned below:

### 1. Human Rights

Facebook Live sessions on human trafficking were conducted on 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2020. Two topics were covered during the session. The topic of the first session was "Vulnerability factors in Human Trafficking". The speaker discussed the provisions of the Constitution of India in the light of fundamental rights and protection of life and dignity of the citizens of India. The second topic focused on Human Trafficking. Speaking on the subject, the speaker highlighted the indicators of Human Trafficking and mentioned that human trafficking constitutes a criminal offence.



### 2. Mental Health of Learners during COVID

Mental health and wellbeing of teachers and the students are cardinal aspects in the teaching —learning process. During the COVID pandemic the whole world grappled with the crisis to keep the mental state of the students intact. Sensitization counselling was need of the hour. Accordingly, the University tried hard to maintain continuous rapport with the students for which the University organized programmes on mental health of student from time to time through social media. Live interaction of the learners with the resource persons was encouraged. ### 6. Webinar on "Literature and History: Australian Perspectives"




### 8. 125<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary year of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose
