#### Agenda Item 5

To ratify the approval of the Competent Authority for creating an Exit Option in Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as 'Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education' as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same.

SB 72.5.1

Prof. Rekha Sharma Sen, Programme Coordinator, reported the approval of the Competent Authority for creating an Exit Option in Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as 'Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education' as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same for ratification of the School Board of SOCE.

The Programme Coordinator presented the rationale for the above as follows:

She informed the School Board that there has been a heavy enrollment in the DECE Programme especially in the states of Rajasthan and Odisha. Given the diverse contexts to which the learners belong, with some coming from marginalized backgrounds, it is likely that some may not be able to navigate all the four Courses of the Diploma (32 Credits) and may yet want a certification with respect to the courses that they have been able to successfully clear.

An Expert Committee, constituted with the approval of the competent authority, advised an exit option as 'Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education' on completion of Course 1 and Course 4 (16 Credits), which make a package equipping the learner with basic theory and practical skills of interacting with children. The exit option 'Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education' would not be advertised as a separate programme. It will be clarified to the learners that the exit option as Certificate will not make them eligible for the same opportunities and job roles as the full Diploma would. The students can exit with a Certificate any time within the 3 year period.

The Expert Committee advised that as and when the new Certificate Programme titled 'Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education' of 20 Credits in collaboration with UNICEF under development in the School is launched, the exit option being presently proposed for the Diploma would be withdrawn as then the learners would have a clear choice right at the outset to select a programme – Certificate or Diploma – as per their suitability.

SB 72.5.2

The School Board agreed with the above rationale and proposal and ratified the approval of the Competent Authority for creating an Exit Option in Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as 'Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education' as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same, as a special case.

Agenda Item 6

To ratify the approval of the Competent Authority for modification in format of strategy for evaluation for Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same.

Prof. Rekha Sharma Sen, Programme Coordinator, reported the approval of the Competent Authority for modification of strategy for evaluation of Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same for ratification of the School Board of SOCE.

The Programme Coordinator presented the rationale for the above as follows:

While the methodology of evaluation *per se* is not changed in terms of the components of evaluation and weightage accorded to each, keeping in mind the large numbers of enrolled students in Odisha and Rajasthan (nearly 40,000 each) and the provision of mother tongue-based education and evaluation, the strategy of evaluation is to be made learner-centric and expedited. One of the features of the modified learner-centric teaching and evaluation strategy is to translate the material into mother tongue and conduct of the examination in mother tongue. Guided by the Expert Committee constituted for this purpose, which was constituted with the approval of the Competent Authority, the following modifications have been incorporated:

 The term end examination for all three theory papers of Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education for all learners will be MCQ based (3 hours, 100 questions) and not a descriptive paper. The question paper will be translated into mother tongue.

2. The Project Work Manual will be converted into a workbook format so that student completes all aspects of the Project Work in this workbook itself and submits the same. A separate Project File made on loose sheets will no longer be accepted. This will be applicable to all students of DECE.

3. In order to do the Project Work, the student has to locate an ECCE centre/ preschool/pre-primary section according to guidelines in a checklist and get the same signed by the representative of the Regional Centre. In order to reduce the burden on the Regional Centre, the checklist will be signed by the teacher-guide at the ECCE centre/ preschool/pre-primary section, instead of the staff of the Regional Centre.

4. Evaluation of Project Work:

Presently, Evaluation is 2 tiered:

**Tier 1** is continuous evaluation which carries 30% weightage. This is done by the Guide at the ECCE centre/ preschool/pre-primary section.

Tier 2 is the Term-end evaluation which carries 70% weightage. This is done at IGNOU Headquarters by checking the submitted Project File and videos of conducted activities.

This evaluation methodology will remain the same but the strategy of implementing this evaluation methodology will be modified for ODISHA AND RAJASTHAN ONLY (mother tongue based education and high enrolment). While the above mentioned strategy will continue as at present for the rest of the country, for Odisha and Rajasthan, the strategy will be decentralized in order to make it mother-tongue based and expedited.

Modifications for decentralization of evaluation strategy for Project Work for mother-tongue based evaluation in Rajasthan and Odisha are as follows:

a) **Tier 1** (which carries 30% weightage) remains the same for the learners who are doing the Project Work under the guidance of the guide in an ECCE centre/nursery school.

In case of learners who are *anganwadi* workers, there is no possibility of Guide as they cannot leave their Anganwadi and go elsewhere to do Project Work, and will be doing the Project work in their own centres.

For *anganwadi* workers as learners, Strategy for Tier 1 (which carries 30% weightage) will be modified as follows:

- The possibility of real-time monitoring of the *anganwadi* workers' work by State Level Master Trainers of the ICDS directorate of WCD, Odisha and Rajasthan will be explored with the state departments.
- For *anganwadi* workers, the counterpart to correction of the Project file by the Guide at the nursery school is as follows:

The Project File of the students who are Anganwadi workers, along with the videos made by them of their daily activities with the children will be submitted by them to the IGNOU Regional Centre. The Regional Centre will get the Project File along with the videos evaluated by the pool of counselors with it.

- b) **Tier 2** (which carries 70% weightage): Project File is not submitted at IGNOU HQ.
- Instead, Face-to-face viva is conducted at the designated locations in Odisha and Rajasthan/ IGNOU study centres.
- The Team conducting the viva will comprise a minimum quorum of 2 people, one of whom will be a counselor, from among the following-
  - ✓ IGNOU Counsellor minimum 1 and preferably 2
  - ✓ Representative of study centre / Regional Centre 1
  - ✓ Select participation by IGNOU faculty through online mode in a certain number of cases only.
- Viva questions to be standardized across all centres.
- c) Student has to pass in Tier 1 and Tier 2 evaluation both.

#### SB 72.6.2

The School Board appreciated the modification in format of evaluation strategy and especially decentralized and mother tongue based evaluation strategy for Project Work in Odisha and Rajasthan, and with the recommendation that there should be a minimum quorum of 2 Experts, and preferably 3, for the Face-to-face viva, ratified the approval of the Competent Authority for modification of format of strategy for the current January 2025 batch as well as any future mother-tongue based large enrolments in other states, in Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same, as a special case.

#### Agenda Item 7

To ratify the approval of the Competent Authority for additional qualifications for appointment of counselors for Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same.

SB 72.7.1

Prof. Rekha Sharma Sen reported the approval of the Competent Authority for additional qualifications for appointment of counselors for Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same for ratification of the School Board of SOCE.

The Programme Coordinator, Prof. Rekha Sharma Sen presented the rationale for the above as follows:

Given the high enrollment, there is need to increase the pool of counselors especially in the states of Rajasthan and Odisha. Guided by the Expert

Committee for this purpose, which was constituted with the approval of the Competent Authority, the following additional qualifications for identifying counselors include:

- TGTs and PGTs in Home Science teaching in schools offering Home Science in classes 11th and 12th.
- 2. State Level Master Trainers (SLMT) of ICDS directorate in Women and Child Development department of the states
- 3. Qualified and experienced practitioners from reputed organizations from the NGO sector

The School Board took note of the above and recommended the inclusion of the cadre of CDPOs, BDOs as Counsellors.

With the above inclusion of the cadre of CDPOs, BDOs the School Board ratified the approval of the Competent Authority for additional qualifications for appointment of counselors for Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education as well as the minutes of the Expert Committee Meeting regarding the same, as a special case.

Agenda Item 9

To consider and approve NSQF Compliant Skill Course with the Job Role – Community Development and Extension Officer as per NCVET Guidelines.

SB 70.9.1

Prof. Rekha Sharma Sen, Director SOCE, informed the School Board that IGNOU has been assigned with the responsibility of designing and development of National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) compliant skill courses as per the National Council for Vocational Education Training (NCVET), the apex regulatory body under the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, and SOCE is one of the Schools that has been given the responsibility of developing NSQF compliant skill courses. Prof. Anita Priyadarshani, Director of STRIDE, was invited as special invitee for this agenda. The Coordinator of the Qualification Pack, Prof. Heena K. Bijli who designed this Qualification presented the agenda. She explained that the proposed Qualification for the job role titled 'Community Development & Extension Officer' is in alignment with NSQF level 6 and has 4 NOS (National Occupational Standards) with a total of 20 credits comprising 600 notional hours. She explained that this Qualification was being proposed due to major skill gaps that exist in the expanding development sector and the urgent need to build a cadre of professionals. The entry level qualification and mode of delivery for curricular transaction was as prescribed in the NSQF. Getting validations from the industry for the

Qualification was a mandatory requirement and Prof. Bijli had received more than 30 validations for this Qualification from UN organisations, reputed national / internationalorganisations, NGOs and CSR foundations. The Qualification File for the job role – Community Development and Extension Officer at NSQF Level 6 was placed for consideration and approval of the School Board.

The School Board appreciated the initiative and congratulated Prof. Heena K. Bijli for the hard work in designing the Qualification at NSQF level 6 for the job role titled - 'Community Development & Extension Officer,' which is of national importance and is significant both for national and international workforce in the development sector. One of the experts pointed out whether it would be appropriate to award 'certificate' for such a Qualification Pack which is at NSQF level 6. Prof. Bijli explained that the word 'certificate' in the Award Column of the template was used in the parlance of NCVET and validations from the industry strongly mandated this Qualification at level 6 for the proposed job role. After much deliberations and acknowledging the importance of this job role, the School Board decided that clarification may be immediately sought by Prof. Bijli and Prof. Priyadarshani for 'certificate' nomenclature of this Qualification.

After consulting NCVET, and reviewing the Qualification File(QF) templates available on the National Qualification Registry portal, National Qualification Register to clarify the matter it was found that qualifications of both Level 7 and Level 6 have been termed as 'certificate' in the award column in the Scientist example for AI-Data template. For Qualification File https://nqr.gov.in/qualification/file/SSC%20Q8104_AI%20Data%20Scientist_V3.pdf Director Animation https://nqr.gov.in/qualification/file/NSQF_Animation_Director.pdf , Digital Manager Marketing https://www.nqr.gov.in/qualification/file/NSQF_Digital_Marketing_Manager. pdf etc. In order to further clarify the matter, the NCVET was consulted and NCVET has confirmed that the term 'certificate' in the award column is in order and is not the same as awards given as degrees, diplomas and certificates under the ODL system. Moreover, the IGNOU NSQF compliant qualifications that have been approved earlier by NCVET have also been designated as 'certificate' in the award column of the QF template. In view of the above, the terminology of NCVET i.e. 'certificate' in the award column may be retained for the Qualification File for the job role of 'Community Development and Extension Officer' at NSQF level 6.
