To Consider and Approve Phase-0 form for coursework for Ph.D in Gender & Development Studies

Prof. Savita Singh, Coordinator (with Prof. Annu J. Thomas) presented the item. The proposal for Ph.D. programme for Gender and Development Studies was approved by the Research Council in its 10th meeting held on 31st December,2007 and Academic Council in its 51st meeting held on March 3, 2010. Ph.D. coursework, based on the M.Phil Coursework and syllabi previously approved in the 5th School Board meeting, alongwith Ph.D. Coursework recommended by the expert committee was placed before the Doctoral Committee for Ph.D. in Gender and Development Studies on 20/9/2016. The coursework as proposed by programme coordinators, was recommended for the approval of the School Board.

Prof. Savita Singh reported that subsequent to the doctoral committee meeting further clarifications regarding credit structure of Ph D course work (8 to 16 credits) in the light of UGC stipulations (Clause 7.1) were obtained from Research Unit, and incorporated in the revised Phase-0 form. The following two courses of 8 credits each were proposed in the revised Phase-0 form:

- 1 Gender and Development: Concepts and Theories
- 2 Research Methodology in Gender and Development Studies

The School Board members discussed the Phase-0 form. It was suggested that course codes may be obtained for the two proposed courses. A detailed discussion followed on the order of the two courses. The Chairperson communicated that as the courses would be transacted simultaneously and not sequentially, the order of the courses may be decided by the Programme Coordinators. The School Board suggested that the minimum eligibility requirements for the Ph.D programme may be carefully deliberated upon and a strong grounding in gender issues may be included as part of the entrance requirements in order to ensure academic rigour.

The Phase-0 form for Ph.D in Gender and Development Studies along with syllabi of the two proposed courses was approved with the above mentioned suggestions.

Agenda Item No.: 21.5.

To Consider and approve Phase-2 form for PG Certificate in Gender, Agriculture and Sustainable Development Programme

Programme Coordinators Dr. G. Uma and Dr. Mita Sinhamahapatra presented the background and details related to the proposed PG Certificate.

The Need Assessment Study for PG Certificate/Diploma in Gender, Agriculture and Sustainable Development was approved in the 13th School Board held on 31st August, 2012. Phase 1 form was approved in the 14th School Board Meeting held on 26th February, 2013 and approved in the Academic Programme Committee (APC) in its 43rd meeting held on 18th October, 2013. The Phase 2 form for PG Certificate/Diploma for Gender, Agriculture and Sustainable Development with exit point for PG Certificate in Gender, Agriculture and Sustainable Development was approved in the 17th School Board Meeting held on 19th February, 2014 and approved by Academic Council Standing Committee in its 38th Meeting held on 25th August, 2014. ACSC suggested that "There should be clear break-up in the Certificate and Diploma components of the programme with a clear cut proposal regarding the exit point and the possibility of adopting a modular format for developing the programme". Based on the recommendations given by the ACSCand the discussion in the meeting of Directors and Programme Coordinators from SOGDS and SOA held on 1st September, 2016, it was proposed that the Programme may be developed initially as a PG certificate in Gender, Agriculture and Sustainable Development and later PG Diploma component may be added. The need assessment study also shows a higher demand (31.1 %) for PG Certificate in

comparison to PG Diploma (28.1%). The Credit structure for PG certificate in Gender, Agriculture and Sustainable Development may be rationalized as per University norms. Accordingly, it was proposed that the credit weightage of the Course 3 may be reduced to 4 credits. The programme coordinators reported that the revised credit structure was circulated to the members of the expert committee and approved by circulation

The School Board discussed the Phase 2 form and made the following recommendations:

It was observed that the Programme was not meant to be technical in nature and may be of greater interest to people from a sociological/ anthropological background. Therefore, it was suggested that the programme content may be aligned more closely with sociology- anthropology to promote interest. Keeping this in mind, scholars such as Prof. Bina Aggarwal, Prof. Swaminathan and other experts of similar background may be contacted for involvement in course development.

The School Board approved the Phase-2 form for PG Certificate in Gender, Agriculture and Sustainable Development Programme with the above mentioned recommendations.

Agenda Item No.: 21.6

To Consider and Approve the 2nd level Need Assessment Study of PG Diploma Programme in Gender in Law (PGDLAW) (Modular approach)

The item was presented by the Programme Coordinators : Dr. Smita M. Patil and Dr. Gurmeet Kaur.

A Need Assessment Study was conducted and approved in the 12th School Board Meeting held on 25th January, 2012. The Phase I (New Phase) form of PG Diploma/Certificate programme in Gender in Law was approved by the 15th School Board of SOGDS held on 25th July, 2013. The 43rd Academic Programme Committee Meeting also approved New Phase I form of PG Diploma / Certificate programme in Gender in Law. Design of the programme was initiated on the positive results of the need assessment survey. The Phase 2 form (New) of PG Diploma in PG Diploma/Certificate programme in Gender in Law was approved and recommended for consideration of Academic Council by the School Board of SOGDS in its 17th meeting held on 19th February, 2014. On 25th August, 2014 Phase II (New) form was placed and presented before the Academic Council Standing Committee by the coordinators. The ACSC suggested the following points to be addressed in the needs assessment study (1) methodology (2) universe and sample size, (3) qualification of academic councilors (4) projection on enrollment of the programme be reviewed. In the light of above suggestions, the coordinators conducted the second level needs assessment study.

The Programme Coordinators Dr. Smita M. Patil and Dr. Gurmeet Kaur presented the details of the 2nd level Need Assessment Study of PG Diploma Programme in Gender in Law (PGDLAW) (Modular approach). They reported that the 2nd level need assessment had been conducted with a reduced sample based on suggestions of ACSC in its meeting held on 25th August. 2014. The School Board discussed the procedures for collection of data for responses and noted the role of the impact of Caste based violence in the responses collected.

The 2nd level Need Assessment Study of PG Diploma Programme in Gender in Law (PGDLAW) (Modular approach) was appreciated and approved by the School Board.

To report on Lateral Entry admission pattern for MAWGS Programme as proposed by the committee chaired by the PVC.

The proposed change in lateral entry admission pattern for MAWGS had been discussed by the School Board in its 20th meeting. The School Board had suggested that in case of January admissions for lateral entry, the students applying for lateral entry in January may also be advised that the ideal admission cycle for lateral entry would be in July due to the progressive nature of the MAWGS programme. The change in lateral entry admission pattern for MAWGS programme as proposed by the School Board was communicated to the Student Registration Division. Student Registration Division emphasized that MAWGS programme has a linking pin course structure unlike other programmes making July lateral entry the ideal option, as suggested earlier by the School Board. The Student Registration Division also pointed out that there may be practical difficulties in informing each student individually regarding the ideal admission cycle due to time and other constraints and therefore the proposed change may be reconsidered. The School Board noted the inputs received from SRD and was in agreement that the existing lateral entry admission pattern for MAWGS should remain the same (July session of subsequent year only).

The School Board noted that there was to be no change in the Lateral Entry admission pattern for MAWGS Programme. The existing provision will be further clarified in the respective Programme Guides of PGDWGS and MAWGS at the time of revision of Programme Guides.
