Shri Pankaj Khanna, Deputy Director, **Planning** and Development Division was present in the meeting to assist the Member Secretary.

At the outset, the Chairman welcomed the members to the meeting of the Planning Board. After a brief introduction by the members, the Chairman informed the Board about the recent academic achievements and major contributions made, where in the university has initiated vocational and training programmes to educate and train youths from Below Poverty Line (BPL) families in tribal area, linking these activities with the local micro, small and medium enterprises and grassroots-level civil society organizations for employability of the learners, their skill upgradation initiatives are being taken up by the various initiates of the University. He briefed about consolidation of the existing academic programmes, few face to face programmes initiated in addition to ODL programmes by few academicians in the campus, Convergence, where-in the IGNOU course material will be utilized for teaching in the conventional university system and Research and Teaching Assistantship (RTA) Scheme for highly meritorious full-time

postgraduates to be prepared as future teachers. These initiatives would directly help in improving the enrolment and retention of students in the ODL system. He also **informed** about the recent Vice-Chancellors meeting where the policy **matters** like the GER enhancement, participation in the Skill mission, IGNOU contribution to the 10-year action plan, networking with several institutions and teacher education were deliberated upon. He informed to the members that IGNOU is exploring all the possibilities of having collaboration with government and private funded academic institutions to deliver various academic, vocational and need based programmes. The recent agreements **for** telecentre.org with support from International Development Research Centre (IDRC) and with various national institutes of repute like Escorts Heart Institute, AllMS were also informed by him.

He mentioned about the Director General UNESCO, Ms Irina Bokova visit and proudly cited her words about the University that 'IGNOU is a living embodiment of the concept of building inclusive knowledge societies in a globalised world.

The Chairman after initial remarks requested Prof. Kalpana Mishra, Member Secretary to present the agenda items.

PB 37.1 To confirm the minutes of Me 36th meeting of the Planning Board held on 6th October, 2009 and the Action Taken Report(s).

PB 37.1.1 Prof. Kalpana Mishra apprised the members that the minutes of the

36th Planning Board meeting were circulated to the members and no comments were received in respect of minutes which are placed at Annexure-1/1.

Chairman informed that since no member has any other comments, the minutes may be confirmed.

- PB 37.1.2 The Planning Board confirmed the minutes of its 36<sup>th</sup> meeting as circulated.
- PB **37.2** To consider **the** revision Academic Programme Approval Phase forms **(Phase-0** to Phase-4 forms) and subsequently the Manual for Programme and **Course Coordinators**.
- PB **37.2.1** Prof. Kalpana Mishra narrated the conceptual and historic backgrounds of the procedure for the development of new academic programmes and the manual developed in this regard in the year 2006. Dr. Pankaj Khare, in continuation to above, informed about the four phases in the development of academic programmes. The University has witnessed massive scaled-up activities during 2006-2010 in all fronts including its academic programme delivery mechanisms. Besides offering of online academic programmes, IGNOU has also commenced Face to Face campus based programmes and collaborative content development and/or content delivery. These all new innovative approaches had not been covered under the Phase Forms and Manual that are in practice and thus calls for an intensive revision through systematic logical study on a given timeline. He emphasized the significance of the proposed mechanism under the current scenario and proposed that the approval process would also cover the face-to-face and web mediated delivery mechanism
- PB **37.2.2** The Planning Board appreciated for the systematic development of Academic Programmes and suggested that revised forms should also focus on evaluation of programme and feed back systems.
- Prof. Kalyan K. Dutta suggested that a separate committee may also be formed for devising the norms for the technology enhanced teaching. Learning methods in which various institutions like the IIT-Mumbai, BITS-Pilani. Thapar University etc. has made considerable progress. He emphasized the need of having a National Policy on the Technology enhanced Learning of Science and Technology. The Planning Board after deliberations suggested that a Committee may be constituted to recommend on the various norms to be worked out for various technical and science academic programmes and place its recommendations before the appropriate authority for

## implementation at the national level

- PB 37.2.4 The Planning Board approved the constitution of following two Committees by authorizing the Vice Chancellor, IGNOU to do so
  - i) A Committee for the revision of Academic Programme Approval Phase forms (Phase-0 to Phase-4 forms) and subsequently the Manual for Programme and Course Coordinators.
  - ii) Committee for framing National Framework and Policy the technology enhanced teaching learning for science and technical academic programmes being offered through alternate modes of delivery.
- PB 37.3 To consider the Academic Council and Academic Programme Committee resolution on delegation of Phase-2 approval to School Boards.
- PB 37.3.1 The member secretary apprised the members about the Phase forms. After deliberations, Prof. Parvin Sinclair suggested that since a committee for the revision of Phase forms has been approved by this Planning Board, the decision taken earlier regarding Phase-II forms may be maintained.
- The Planning Board took note of the above deliberations and approved the Academic Council resolution made in its 46th meeting held on 13th January, 2009 (Item No. 46.5.5.) to empower the School Boards for the approval of Phase II forms, till the time the revision of Phase forms is completed I implemented.
- PB 37.4 To consider Minutes of the Meeting of the EFC held under the Chairmanship of Secretary (Expenditure) on 24th November 2009.
- PB 37.4.1 The Chairman informed about the EFC meeting held under the Chairmanship of Secretary (Expenditure) on 24th November 2009 to consider the 11th Plan proposals of IGNOU related to various schemes of infrastructure facilities at Headquarters, Regional centres. Community Colleges and Skill Development Mission and development of human resources.
- PB 37.4.2 The Planning Board after deliberations noted the Minutes of the

Meeting of the EFC held under the Chairmanship of Secretary (Expenditure) on 24th November 2009.

**PB 37.5** To consider the progress made and **draft** Manual prepared for the Community College Scheme of IGNOU.

PB 37.5.1

Dr. C. K. Ghosh, Nodal Officer, Community College Scheme enlightened the Planning Board about the roles of the Community Colleges in work force development. He apprised that with the launch of Community Colleges by Hon'ble Minister of State for Human Resource Development, **Smt D**. Purandeswari, in July 2009, the process of institutionalization of the Community Colleges has **gained momentum** and it was felt that various norms **related** to regulatory, programme credits, student registration, examination etc. are required to be formalized. He informed the various aspects of the draft Manual prepared in this regard with progress achieved in the Community College Scheme.

PB 37.5.2

The Planning Board members appreciated the quality of comprehensive draft Manual and expressed their willingness to open Community Colleges in their respective institutions. Prof. B.P. Saniav suggested-for formulating a committee to meet regional needs and work out the feasibility of convergence of educational programmes being offered by the Community Colleges with traditional academic programmes being offered by the higher education institutions. The Committee may also suggest the means by which the degrees offered by these Community Colleges shall be recognised by the industrial and corporate houses and also to devise a system of getting lateral entry to the higher degree programmes in the Country on behalf of Central University of Tamil Nadu. Prof. B. P. Sanjay offered facilitating the Committee to visit CUTN for finding viability of opening a Centre for implementation of such scheme for Tamil Nadu region.

PB 37.5.3

The Planning Board noted the **progress** made on the draft Manual prepared **for** the Community **College** Scheme of **IGNOU** and authorized the Vice-Chancellor to constitute a Committee to meet regional needs and various other aspects for the development of various academic programmes by the Community Colleges.

International Hospitality Administration in discussion with the respective School

PB 37.7 To consider and approve the Award of Certificate/ Diploma/ Associate Degree to the Army Personnel registered under IGNOU-Indian Army Community College Gyandeep Project. (TABLED ITEM)

PB 37.7.1 The Chairman apprised the Planning Board about the association of Indian Any with IGNOU through Gyandeep Project wherein, a soldier, desirous to enhance his educational standard, will take admission to a Community College in his/her Regiment Training Centre and will pursue the course according to his/her time and pace. After completion of two years, slhe will be entitled for an Associate Degree. If the candidate wants to pursue higher education after acquiring the Associate Degree, s/he will be given lateral entry to the third year of the three-year degree course for graduation. The certificate will empower himlher to get the second career after retirement from the Army. In order to carry forward this objective, a MoU was signed by Lieutenant General Mukesh Sabharwa! Adjutant General in the presence of Army Chief General Deepak Kapoor in September 2009. The MoU seeks to confer educational certification to soldiers of the Indian Any, within the parameters laid down by IGNOU for Community Colleges, recognizing the 'in-service' training taken by them.

The Planning Board members appreciated this collaboration that the army personnel shall retire with a formal degree from IGNOU and would be able to contribute to society in a more meaningful way. The Planning Board recommended that a similar agreement may be worked out with the Indian Navy and for Air Force also.

The Planning Board noted the above deliberations and progress made under the IGNOU-Indian Army Community College Gyandeep Project.
