## **Objective of the Course**

# Important Instructions for Preparing Production Portfolio

- i. All written work must be in your own handwriting.
- ii. Compile all the written works in a folder and mention your details (Name, Enrolment number, Programme Code, Course Code, Study Centre Code, Regional Centre Code, Email id, Phone number and Address) on the front page.
- iii. Audio and video files must be submitted in a CD/DVD/Pen drive. Attach it properly with your portfolio and don't forget to mention your details on it.
- iv. Keep all your audio and video files ready to show at the time of viva voce.
- v. Learners are advised to make their own Production Portfolios and not copy them from anywhere. Production Portfolios may be rejected if evidence of copying or other malpractices is found.
- vi. Don't forget to keep a copy of the production portfolio with you.

# When submitting practical work, please include the following:

- 1. Cover page which includes Name, Enrolment number, Programme Code, Course Code, Study Centre Code, Regional Centre name and code, Email id, Phone number and Address.
- 2. IGNOU Identity Card
- 3. Examination fee receipt of MJML 221. Examination fee is valid only for the examination for which it has been deposited. Hence Pay the exam fee only after checking your preparation.
- 4. Table of 10 activities of Production Portfolio given in this practical manual.
- 5. All the 10 activities together in one file along with CD/DVD/Pen drive.

# EVALUATION OF PRACTICAL COURSE

There will be a term end examination for this practical course. Learners have to fill the examination form to appear in the term end examination of this course like any other course of this programme, but the nature of the term end examination of this practical course will be different.

#### **Term End Practical Examination**

- Maximum Marks: 100
- Evaluation of Production Portfolio (100 Marks)
- No viva-voce component in the evaluation

### **Passing Criteria**

The maximum marks of this practical course will be 100. **Minimum 40%** will be required to complete this practical course successfully.

#### **Practical Course: Duration Related Norms**

You can complete the PG Diploma Programmes maximum in three years and Master Degree Programmes maximum in four years. You need to complete your practical courses successfully within the above mentioned time frame. As far as minimum time is concerned, you can appear in the term end examination of MJML-221 only after one year of your registration. For example – If you have taken admission in January 2025 admission cycle, then you can appear in December 2025 Term End Examination, not before that. Similarly, if you have taken admission in July 2025 admission cycle, then you can appear in June 2026 Term End Examination, not earlier than that.

- IGNOU takes admission in two admission cycles in a year:
   January Admission Cycle and July Admission Cycle
- IGNOU conducts term-end examinations twice a year: June term-end examinations and December term-end examinations
- Please check your **registration details** on IGNOU website to know the validity of your registration.
