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1. Introduction

The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) holds a distinctive position as the only National Open University in India established by an Act of Parliament in 1985, with a mandate to provide inclusive, flexible, and accessible higher education through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode. What sets IGNOU apart is its dedicated International Division, which spearheads the University's global outreach and academic collaboration initiatives. As a unique institutional model in the Indian higher education system, IGNOU integrates internationalisation into its core functions by facilitating partnerships with overseas institutions, recognising Overseas Study Centres, and offering various academic programmes to international learners. Through this Division, IGNOU not only advances India's educational diplomacy but also reinforces its role as a global player in open and distance learning. To expand its international presence, the University follows a four-fold approach of 4 Cs: "Collaboration, Cooperation, Coordination, and Competition".

This division acts as a single window for all international operations, offering comprehensive student support services to both Foreign Students Residing in India (FSRI) and those overseas. From admissions and examinations to evaluation and degree conferral, the International Division ensures a seamless academic journey for its diverse international cohort. It also plays a pivotal role in promoting and monitoring IGNOU's online programs for international learners.

2. Genesis and Growth

In 1995, the need was identified by IGNOU to extend its presence internationally to meet the educational aspirations of the Indian diaspora residing abroad for employment and other reasons. In response, the Board of Management (BoM), at its 43rd meeting, resolved to constitute a committee to examine and implement international operations. Accordingly, an Advisory Committee was formed to operationalize the international role of the University, vide Notification No. AD/1/195/2215 dated 13.12.1995. The Committee's report was presented to the BoM at its 50th meeting held on 28.03.1997, wherein the proposal for offering IGNOU programmes through Partner Institutions was approved. Subsequently, an International Cell was established at IGNOU in 1996, with the mandate to foster bilateral and multilateral academic collaborations. In August 1997, the IGNOU Act was amended to make a provision that enabled the University to set up Study Centres outside India.

Provision in the IGNOU Act

The provisions of the Indira Gandhi National Open University Act 1985, state that (1) *There shall be established a University by the name of "the Indira Gandhi National Open University".* (2) *The headquarters of the University shall be at Delhi and it may establish or maintain Colleges, Regional Centres, and Study Centres at such other places in India as it may deem fit. Provided that the University may, with the prior approval of the Visitor, also establish Study Centres outside India.* (Proviso to Sub-Section (2) of Section 3 of the Indira Gandhi National Open University Act, 1985, enacted by the Parliament in August 1997. The amended Act came into force on 6th December 1997). Section 6 of the Act also provides for the establishment of Study Centres outside India.

"The University shall in the exercise of its powers have jurisdiction over the whole of India and to the Study Centres outside India". (Amendment of Section 6 of the Indira Gandhi National Open University Act, 1985 enacted by the Parliament in August 1997. The amended Act came into force on 16th December 1997).

Further, in July 2002, the International Cell, the unit responsible for handling the international operations of IGNOU was upgraded to a division. The Division at that time was entrusted with the following responsibilities:

- i) Promoting IGNOU's academic programmes outside the country by establishing bilateral and multilateral cooperation and exchange,
- ii) Entering into partnerships with established institutions in other countries,
- iii) Licensing the course materials of IGNOU, and
- iv) Coordinating the training programmes for the personnel of open universities outside India.

3. Mandate

The International Division of IGNOU is dedicated to enhancing the University's global presence by promoting academic excellence, fostering innovation, and facilitating international collaboration. Its mission is to expand the University's international footprint through strategic partnerships, academic exchanges, and cross-border initiatives. By offering market-responsive and globally benchmarked professional programmes, the Division aims to equip learners with the knowledge, skills, and competencies necessary for global employability and competitiveness. It actively engages with governmental bodies, non-governmental organizations, and research institutions to encourage student participation in community development, applied research, skill enhancement, and capacity-building initiatives. Furthermore, the Division is committed to the continuous revision and internationalisation of curricula to ensure alignment with global trends, industry demands, and evolving academic standards.

The core objectives of the International Division are:

- To expand IGNOU's international presence through a strategic framework emphasizing collaboration, cooperation, coordination, and competitive engagement;
- To foster the internationalisation of higher education by establishing and nurturing bilateral and multilateral academic partnerships;
- To develop strong networks with globally reputed educational institutions and inter-governmental organizations, thereby enhancing global access to quality higher education;
- To deliver IGNOU's academic programmes internationally through both Open and Distance Learning (ODL) and online modalities;
- To promote the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) and its associated values within global academic and cultural platforms; and
- To reinforce cultural, educational, and scientific cooperation through academic exchanges, joint programmes, and collaborative research initiatives with international partners.

4. Role and Functions

The International Division serves as the centralized coordinating body for all international operations of the University. Its primary functions are:

- To function as the central coordinating authority for all international operations and engagements of the University, serving as a single-window interface for global academic initiatives;
- To oversee the establishment, recognition, and operational management of Overseas Study Centres (OSCs);
- To provide comprehensive academic and administrative support services to overseas learners and Foreign Students Residing in India (FSRI);
- To conduct admission, evaluation, examination, and award of degrees; and
- To facilitate and coordinate international delegations and institutional visits aimed at fostering academic exchange and promoting strategic global partnerships.

5. IGNOU's Overseas Presence

At present, the University has a presence in 70 countries (Table 1) through academic engagements and in 57 countries through MoAs. IGNOU enrolled 2625 students during the July 2024 and January 2025 admission cycles through its 25 Overseas Study Centres in 15 countries across the globe.

In addition, the University offers online academic programmes in 19 African countries through *e-VidyaBharti* and the *e-ArogyaBharti* Network projects in collaboration with TCIL under the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India.

The university has been offering a three-month basic course in Hindi for International students in collaboration with the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) and Central Hindi Directorate (CHD) in 42 countries.

The names of the countries where IGNOU has a presence is given above in **Table 1**.

6. Admissions

International students at IGNOU are classified into two categories: Overseas Students and Foreign Students Residing in India (FSRI). Overseas Students may enrol in IGNOU programmes through its network of 25 Overseas Study Centres located across 15 countries, subject to eligibility criteria and other requirements. Foreign Students Residing in India can register either through the International Division or any of the IGNOU Regional Centres within the country.

The Common Prospectus for International Learners, containing information on admission, re-registration, examination guidelines, and other university regulations, is available on the IGNOU website. Admission, re-registration, and examination portals for international students are also accessible online for easy processing. Additionally, international students can directly enrol in 44 online programmes through a distinct Admission Portal for International Learners.

International Learners admissions are efficiently processed through the SAMARTH platform, with comprehensive guidelines outlined in the dedicated prospectus to ensure a smooth and transparent enrolment process. To date, IGNOU has successfully enrolled approximately 92,000 international learners (since its inception from 1997 to 2025), including both Foreign Students Residing in India (FSRI) and students from overseas. The number of learners admitted during 2020-2025 is given in **Table 2**.

7. Programmes on offer

The University offers a diverse array of Open and Distance Learning (ODL) and Online programmes, each designed with clearly defined structures, fee schedules, and academic outcomes tailored to the needs of international learners.

At present, the University offers 176 ODL programmes through 25 Overseas Study Centres located in 15 countries (**Appendix 1**). The programmes span a wide range of disciplines and are offered at the Certificate, Diploma, Postgraduate Diploma, Undergraduate, and Postgraduate levels. In addition, 44 online programmes are also offered to International Students (**Appendix 2**).

The Foreign Students Residing in India (FSRI) can register in all academic programmes on offer (**Appendix 1**) for national students through any of the IGNOU Regional Centres in India subject to fulfillment of educational and other requirements.

8. Learner Support Services

Learners benefit from a robust Learning Management System (LMS) and comprehensive support services provided by Overseas Study Centres (OSCs), which include orientation sessions, academic counselling, and induction programmes. The University maintains high standards for evaluation and certification, with rigorous examination and assessment processes, culminating in the award of degrees and convocation ceremonies. Additionally, the International Division conducts regular orientation sessions for Overseas Coordinators to standardize operational practices and enhance the quality of learner engagement. The Overseas Facilitator initiative further strengthens outreach and support at the local level through appointed institutional partners.

The Overseas Study Centres (OSCs) serve as the international representatives of IGNOU in their respective countries. Each OSC is entrusted with the responsibility of promoting the University's programmes within its jurisdiction and providing the necessary infrastructural support, including physical facilities, computing resources, library access, and human resources, to ensure effective functioning. OSCs are also responsible for admitting students following the eligibility criteria prescribed for each programme, offering both pre-admission and post-admission services such as academic counselling and practical sessions, and identifying faculty for programme delivery at the centre.

Further, OSCs are required to conduct semester-end examinations in June and December every year, aligned with Indian Standard Time (IST). They also manage the collection of various types of fees, including programme fees, re-registration fees, and examination fees. As per University policy, 50% of the programme, re-registration, and examination fees are shared with the OSCs, while other types of fees are retained entirely by the University. IGNOU provides comprehensive guidelines and maintains regular coordination with the OSCs on matters such as the empanelment of academic counsellors, admission finalization, distribution of study materials in soft or hard copy formats, maintenance of student records, administration of term-end examinations, result declaration, and issuance of certificates.

Recognition Process for Overseas Study Centres (OSCs) as Approved by the Board of Management in its 147th Meeting

The recognition of Overseas Study Centres follows a structured process, as approved by the Board of Management in its 147th meeting held on 24th February 2022:

1. Receipt of application from interested overseas institutions seeking affiliation as an OSC.
2. Scrutiny of the application by IGNOU to assess eligibility and compliance with institutional requirements.
3. Forwarding of the proposal to the relevant Embassy or High Commission of India for verification of the institution's credentials and claims.
4. Submission of the verification report by the Embassy/High Commission, which is then placed before the Board of Management for consideration and approval.

The University provides comprehensive student support services to Overseas Study Centres (OSCs) and Foreign Students Residing in India (FSRI), encompassing all key academic and administrative functions such as admission, examination, evaluation, award of degrees, and integrated ICT-based support systems.

The International Division serves as the nodal centre for the promotion, delivery, and monitoring of online programmes for international learners. A dedicated Learning Management System (LMS) portal has been developed to support this initiative, currently hosting 45 online programmes.

The details of the 25 Overseas Study Centres across 15 countries is given below in **Table 3**.

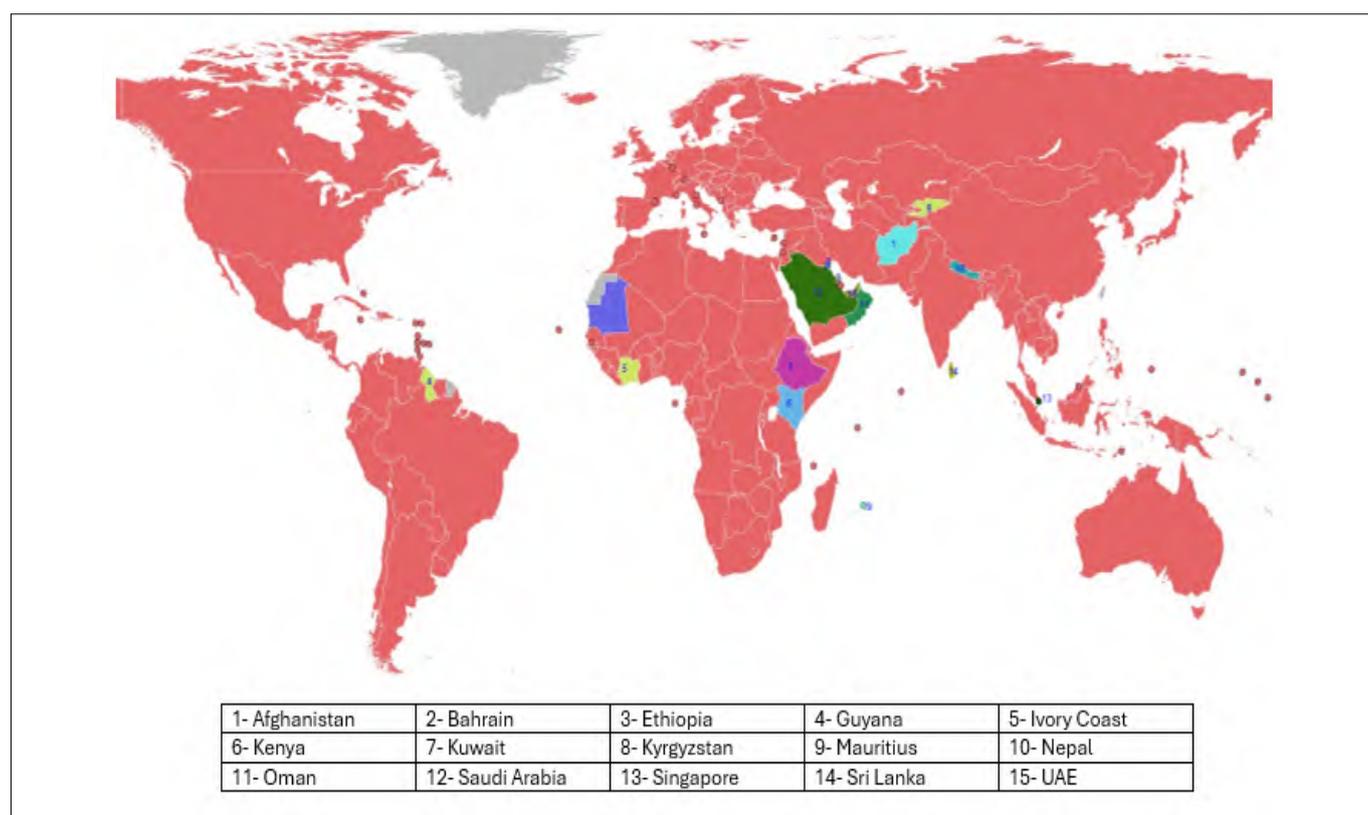

9. Student Evaluation

The evaluation process for international learners enrolled in IGNOU's programmes is carried out in alignment with the University's academic policies and standards. All assessments, including assignments, practicals, and term-end examinations, are conducted as per the approved guidelines and academic calendar of the University. Term-end examinations are held twice a year in June and December and are conducted at the respective Overseas Study Centres (OSCs) following Indian Standard Time (IST). The evaluation is centralized and managed by the University to ensure uniformity and academic integrity across all centres, including those located abroad.

Upon successful completion of the programme requirements, international learners are conferred degrees, diplomas, or certificates during the University's Annual Convocation. International learners who are unable to attend the convocation in person are facilitated through their respective OSCs or embassies/high commissions, ensuring they receive their awards in a timely and dignified manner. The International Division coordinates with relevant authorities to ensure seamless conduct of the convocation process for international learners, thereby upholding the global credibility and outreach of IGNOU's academic programmes.

10. Overseas Coordinators' Meet

The University organizes regular meetings with its Overseas Coordinators to discuss and strategize on various aspects of its international programmes. These meetings, often referred to as the Overseas Coordinators Meet, involve coordinators from various Overseas Study Centers and representatives from IGNOU and the Ministry of Education, India.

Key aspects of IGNOU's overseas meetings:

- **Collaboration and Networking:** The meetings provide a platform for IGNOU to collaborate with its partners in various countries and build a strong network of Overseas Coordinators.
- **Programme Promotion and Expansion:** These meetings promote IGNOU's online programmes and explore opportunities for expanding its presence in different regions.
- **Feedback and Improvement:** The meetings are a valuable source of feedback from Overseas Coordinators, which helps IGNOU identify areas for improvement and enhance the quality of its programmes.
- **Student Support:** The meetings also address issues related to student support, such as admission procedures, course delivery, and counselling services for international learners.

11. Overseas Facilitators

The University's "Overseas Facilitator" scheme is instrumental in facilitating the promotion and growth of IGNOU's online programmes across the globe. The signing of a *Memorandum of Agreement* with 14 Overseas Study Centres during the 10th Overseas Coordinators Consortium Meet in 2022 (Phase I); a *Memorandum of Agreement* (MoA) with 'ICA, Education Pvt. Ltd.' (ICAEPL), Nepal on 05th February 2024 and another with the 'Centre for Open and Distance Education' (CODE), Kenya on 24th September 2024 has helped foster the Overseas Facilitator scheme.

12. Collaborations

In alignment to expand global outreach and in pursuit of the goals outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the International Division has undertaken several significant collaborations with premiere Universities and Institutes across the globe.

The International Division has forged key collaborations to advance IGNOU's global educational mission, including:
