3. “Heathcliff in *Wuthering Heights* evokes both sympathy and derision.” Do you agree with this statement ? Critically analyse the character of Heathcliff. 20
4. Comment on the theme of ‘self-improvement’ in *Great Expectations*. 20
5. “George Eliot is actually conscious of her role as a historian of society.” Comment with reference to *Middlemarch*. 20
6. Discuss the significance of the title *Heart of Darkness* in the portrayal of characters and continents. 20
7. “In ‘*A Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man*’ Stephen’s growth into adulthood is turbulent because of his inability to relate to people in general and to women in particular.” Do you agree ? Give reasons for your answer. 20

8. What do you understand by 'gender justice' ? In what ways is this denied to Mrs. Moore and Adela in *A Passage to India* ? 20
9. *The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie* is a significant contribution to the evolution of feminist fiction. Discuss. 20

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
