Computers are capable of doing extremely complicated work in all branches of learning. They can solve the most complex

mathematical problems or put thousands of unrelated facts in order. These machines can be put to varied uses. For instance, they can provide information on the best way to prevent traffic jams. This whole process by which machines can be put to work for us has been called 'automation'. In the future, automation may enable human beings to enjoy more leisure than they do today. The coming of automation is bound to have important social consequences.

Some years ago, an expert on automation, Sir Leon Bagrite, pointed out that it was a mistake to believe that these machines could 'think'. There is no possibility that human beings will be "controlled by machines".

Though computers are capable of learning from their mistakes, they need detailed instructions from human beings to operate.

They can never, as it were, lead independent lives or "rule the world" by making decisions of their own.

Sir Leon said that in future, computers would be developed that would be small enough to carry in the pocket. The ordinary people would be able to use them to obtain valuable information. Computers could be plugged into a national network and be used like radios. For instance, people going on holiday could be informed about weather conditions. Car drivers can be given alternate routes when there are traffic jams. This will enable people who do not share a common language to talk to each other

without any difficulty or to read foreign publications.
