- and the promotion of human rights? Use examples from different political and social contexts to illustrate your points.
- 3. Explain the concept of a Knowledge Society. What are its primary features and how does it affect human development and social progress?
- 4. How do ethical principles apply to online news reporting? Discuss specific ethical challenges faced by online news organizations.
- 5. Examine the core philosophy and principles behind Open Source Software (OSS). How do concepts such as transparency, collaboration and freedom define the open-source ecosystem?
- 6. Analyze the impact of e-Governance on public administration and service delivery. How do the provisions for legal recognition of electronic records and digital signatures facilitate e-Governance?
