4. Discuss the theme of martyrdom in T. S. Eliot's *Murder in the Cathedral*. 20
5. Beckett's *Waiting for Godot* is a statement about the human condition. Do you agree ? Give a reasoned answer. 20
6. Discuss Shaw's *Pygmalion* as a play that denounces social snobbery and class distinctions. 20
