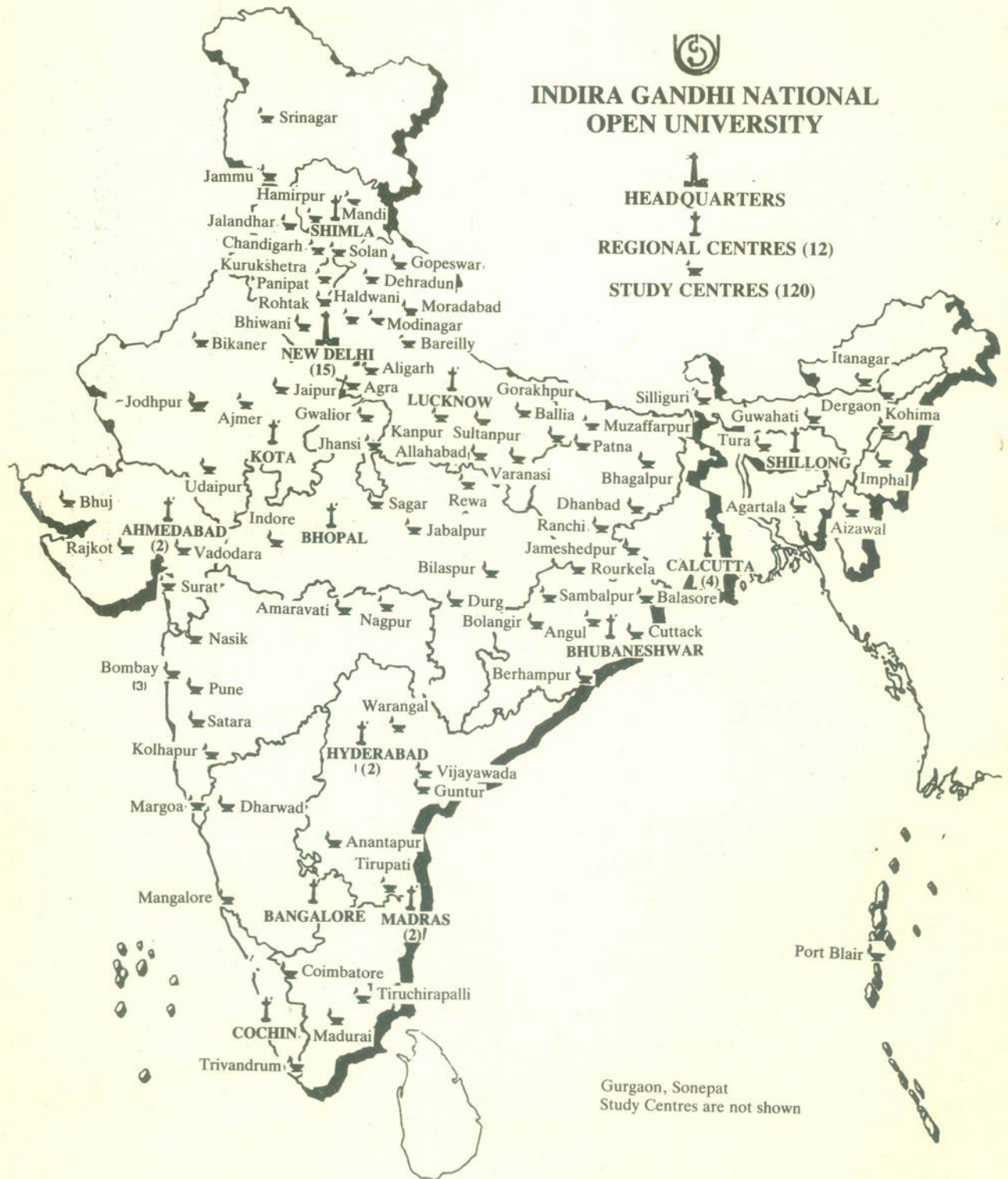

AGE WISE ANALYSIS OF TOTAL ENROLMENT

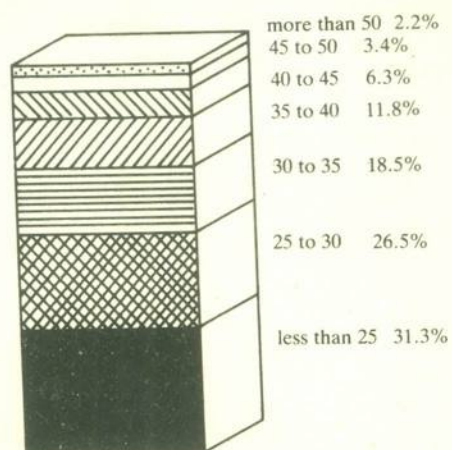

CATEGORY ANALYSIS TO TOTAL ENROLMENT

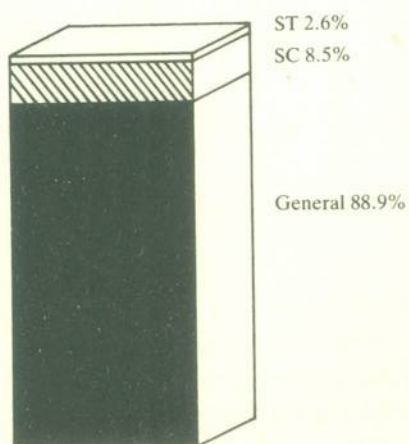

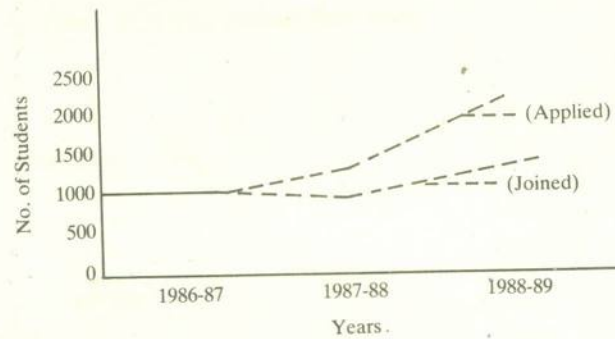
भोजन और पोषण में प्रमाण-पत्र कार्यक्रम

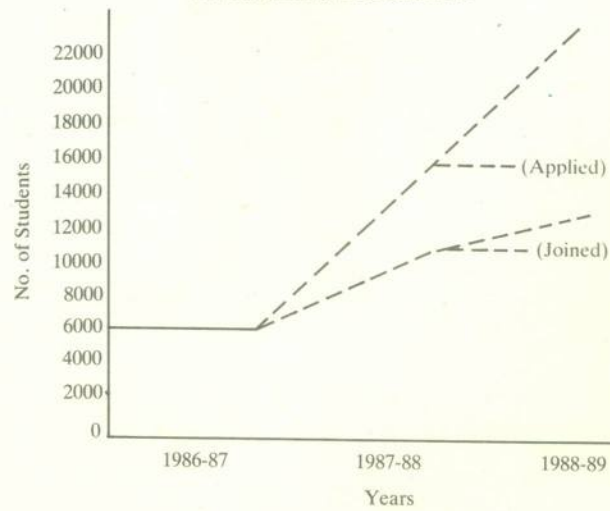

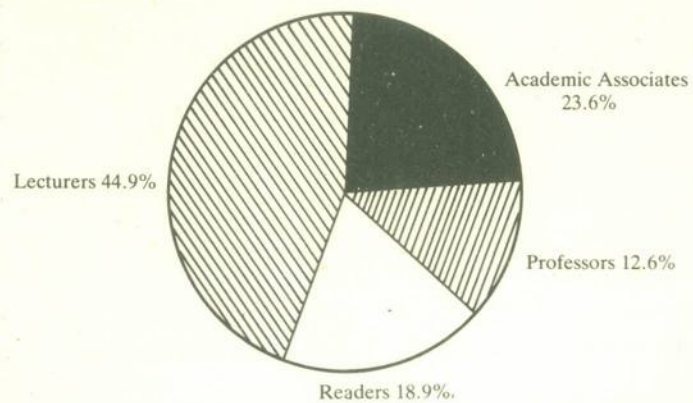

**DIPLOMA IN MANAGEMENT**



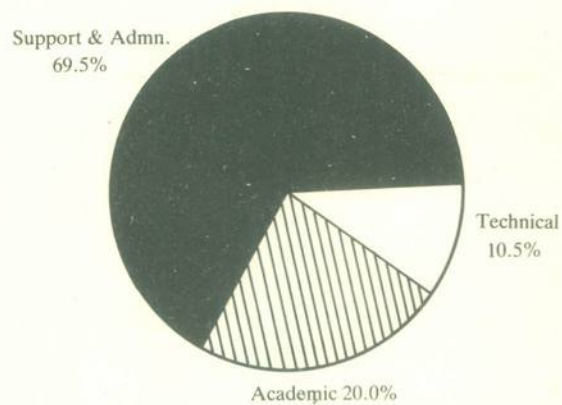

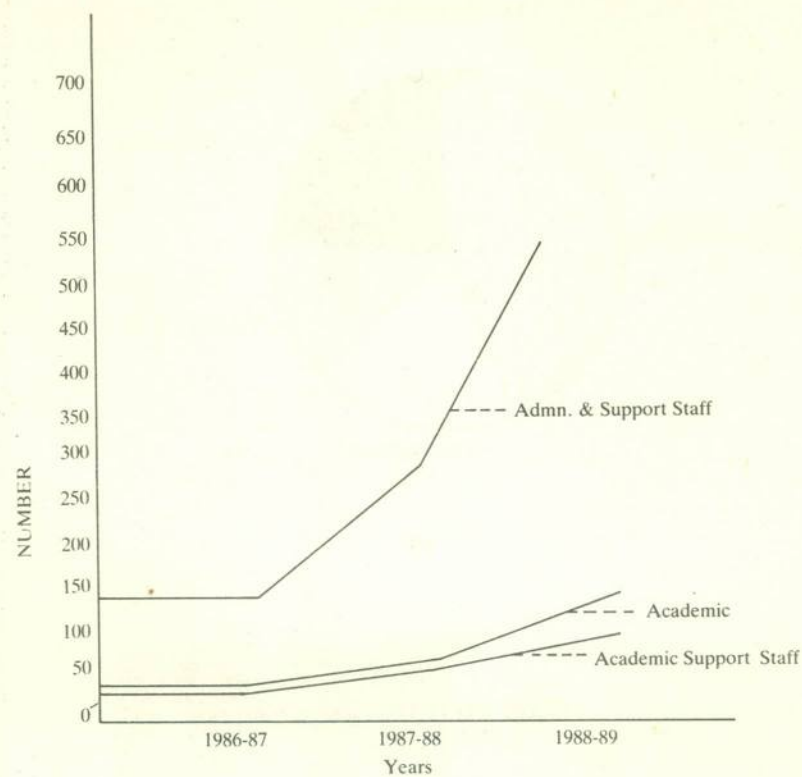
**STAFF DISTRIBUTION  
(AS ON 31-3-89)**





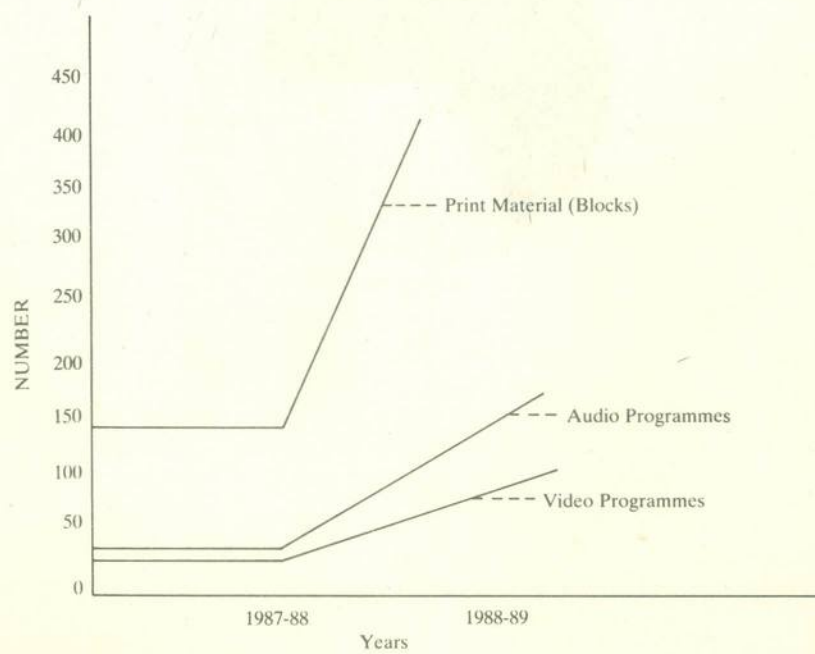

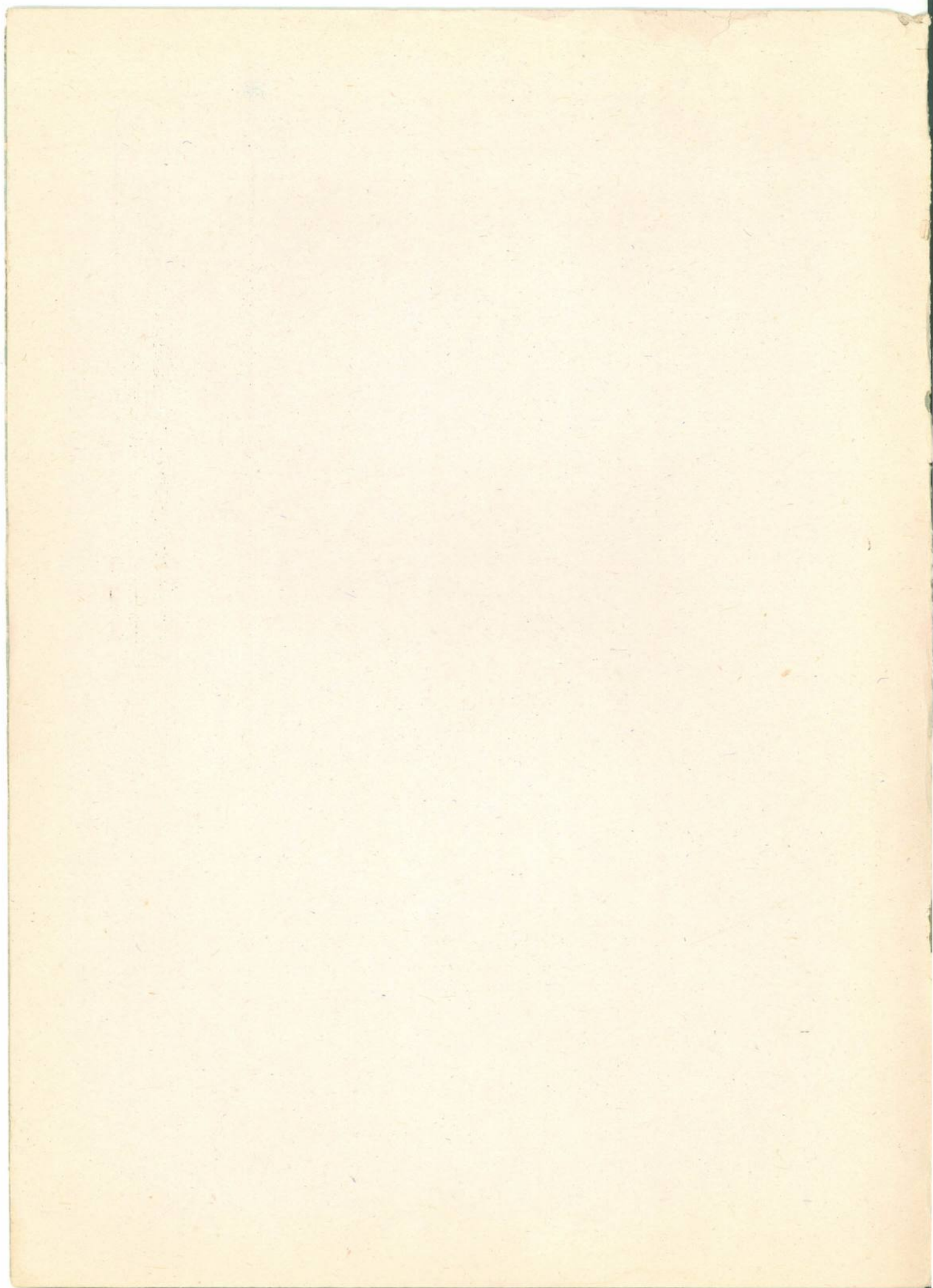
