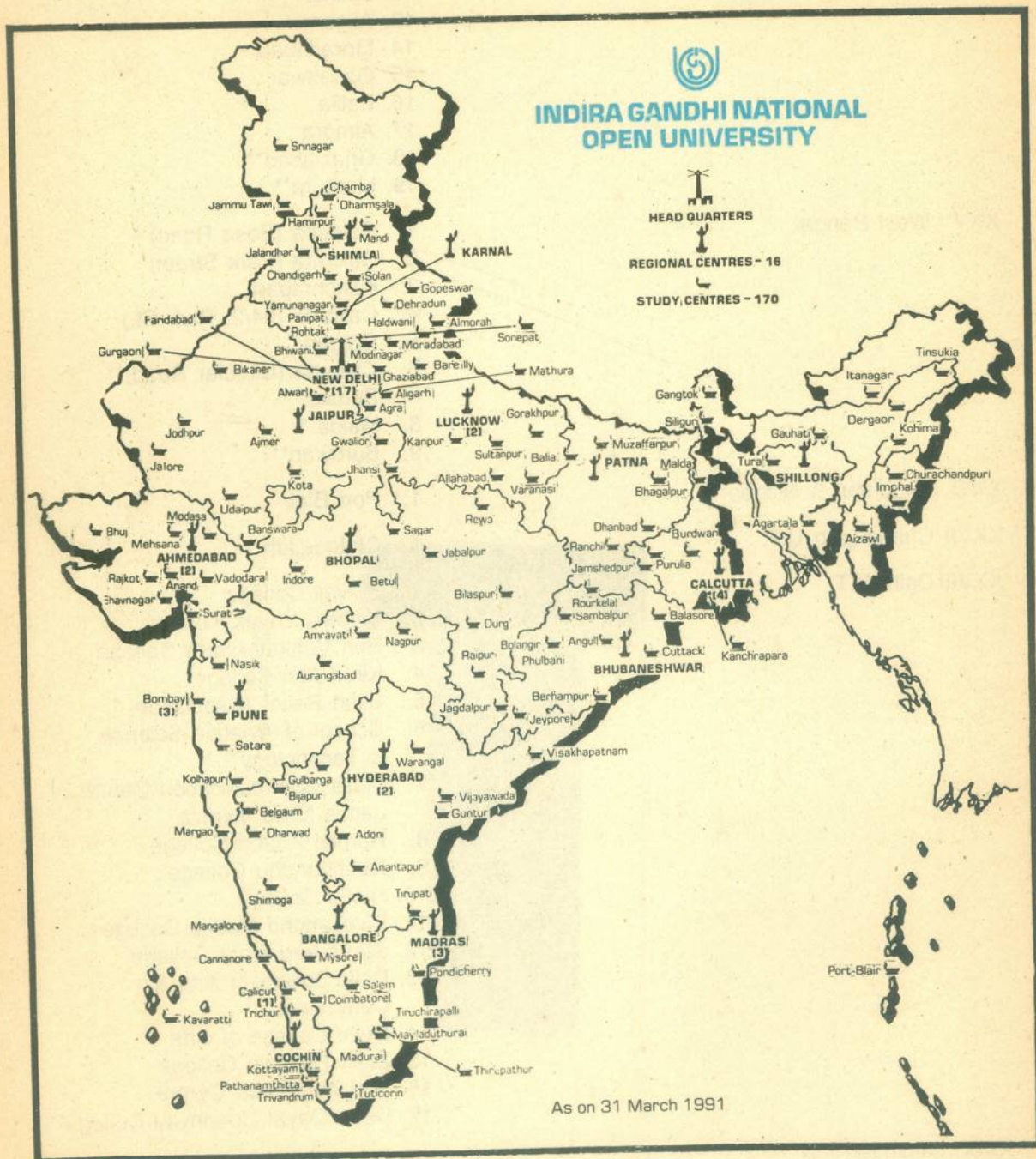

Student Response : Diploma in Distance Education

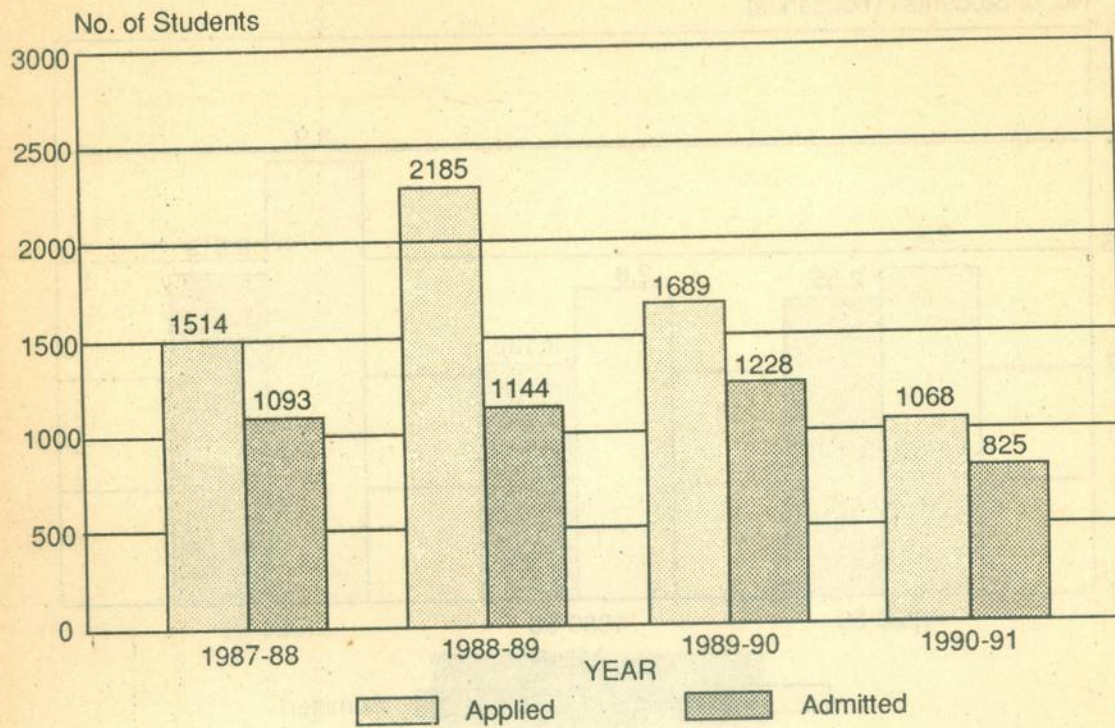

Student Response : Diploma in Management

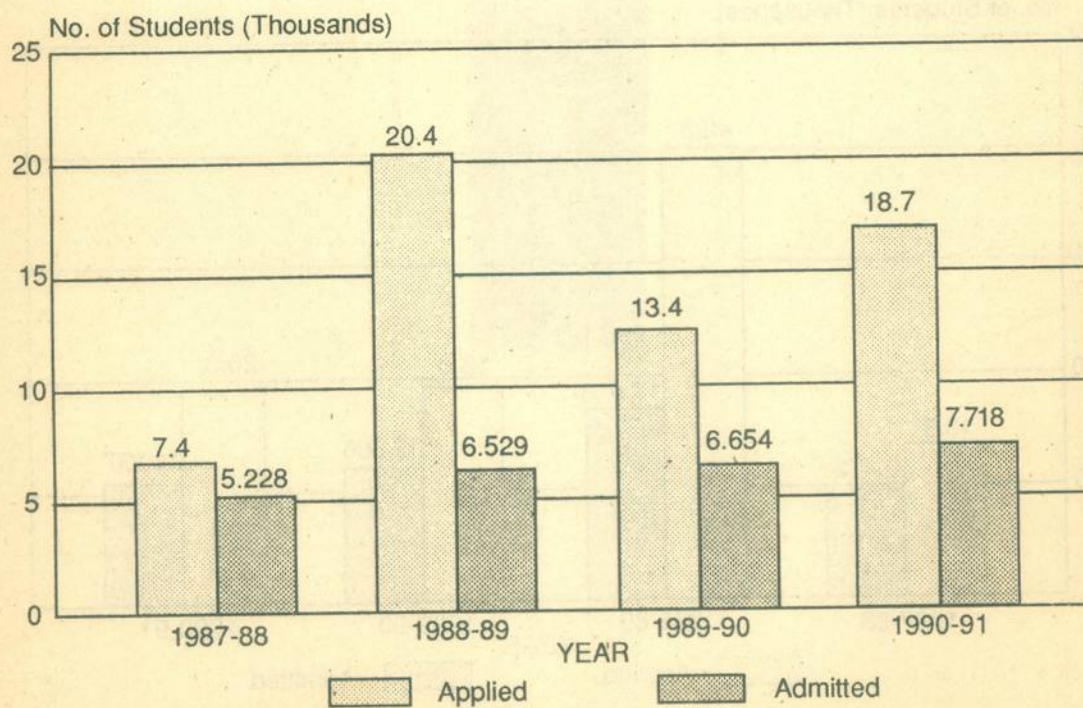

Student Response : Certificate in Food & Nutrition

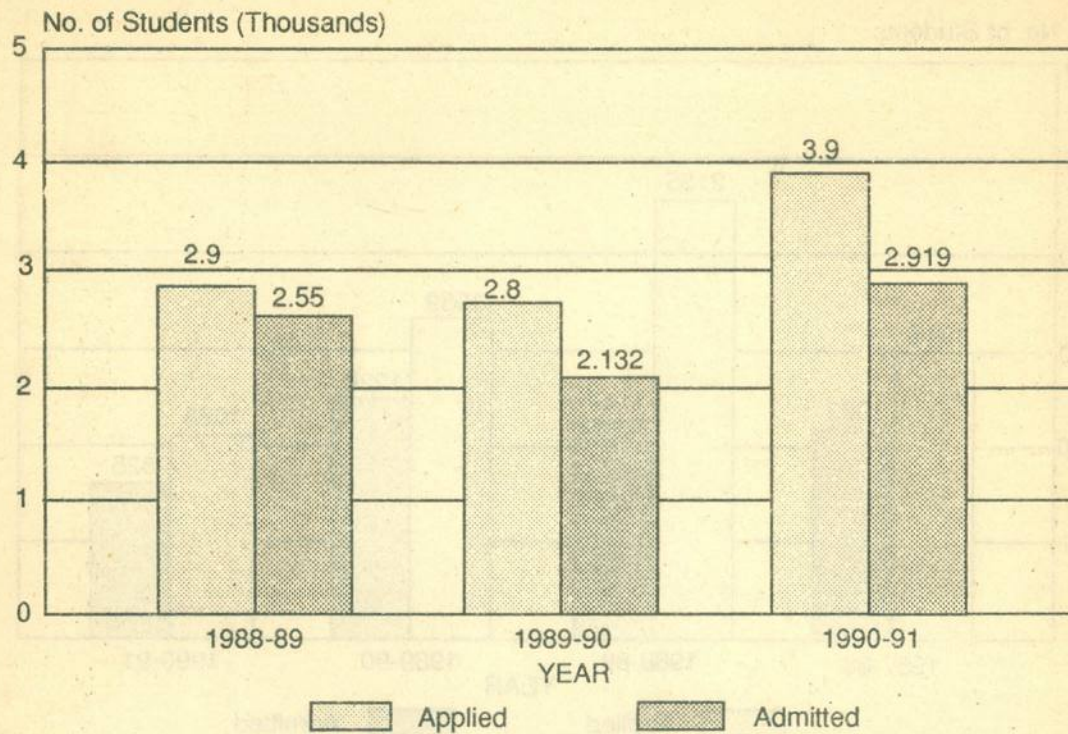

Student Response : Bachelor's Degree (Preparatory Programme)

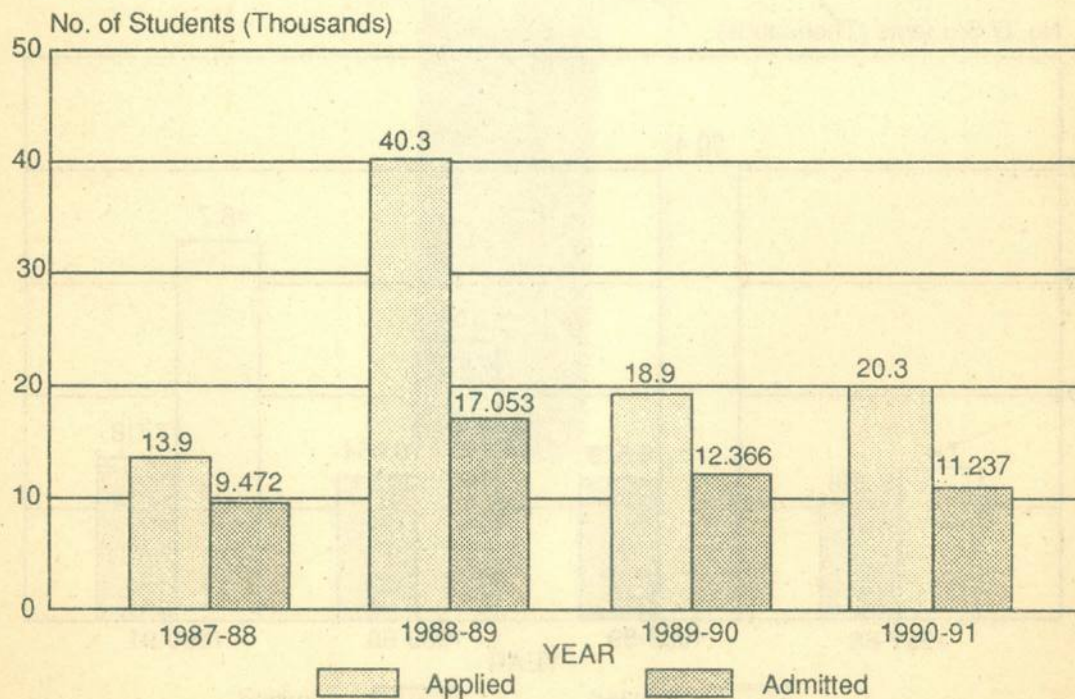

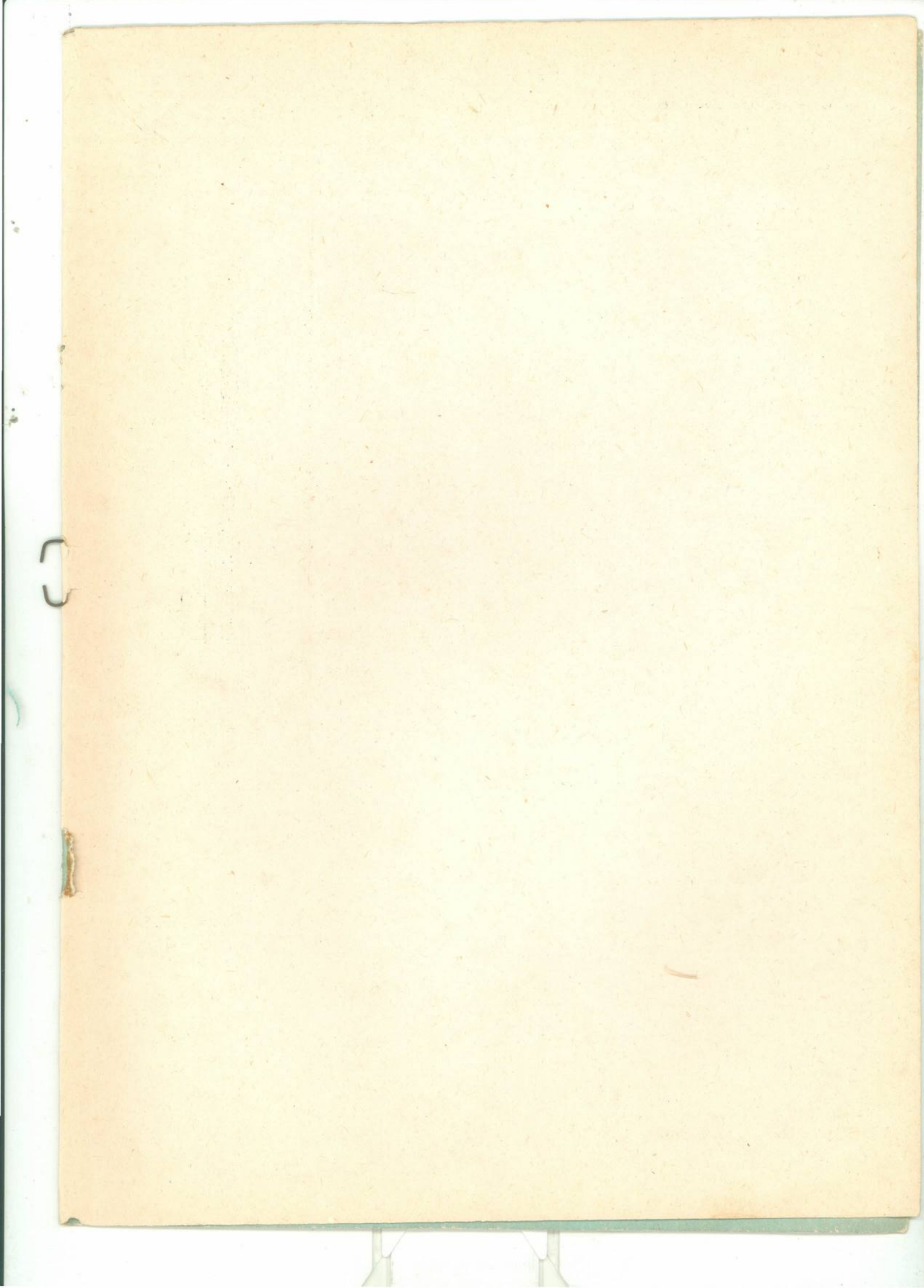
