At the outset, the Member Secretary welcomed the Chairperson, Member(s), and Special Invitee(s) to the 50thMeeting of the Planning Board (PB) and requested the Chair for opening remarks.

The Vice Chancellor and Chairperson of the Planning Board Prof. Nageshwar Rao welcomed all the members of the Planning Board. The Chairperson welcomed Dr. Manroop Singh Meena, Pro-Vice Chancellor and Prof. Srikant Mohapatra, Pro-Vice Chancellor who joined recently. He then welcomed Prof. Neeti Agrawal as new Member Secretary in the Planning Board. The Chairperson also formally welcomed the new members and placed on records the valuable contribution of the outgoing members. He also placed on record the valuable contributions made by Dr. Pankaj Khare, Director(P&DD) during his tenure as Member Secretary of the Planning Board who has been superannuated.

The Chairperson informed that the last Planning Board meeting was conducted on 07th August 2021 through online mode. Since then, the four meetings of APC of the Planning Board Standing Committee were convened. He then apprised the Planning Board about the progress made by the University. The highlights are as follows:

- The focus of NEP is on capacity utilisation IGNOU is collaborating with different agencies. A proposal from Dattopant Thengadi National Boaard of workers education and development to train the workers in the organised and unorganized sectors has been received. Apart from this a proposal to train cooperatives has also been received. The Models which are already present with them will be reviewed. MoU is ready and a pilot study will be conducted shortly.
- The project Agniveer is ready for launch and has duly been approved by all the approving bodies.
- All the programmes of IGNOU will be approved by NCVET and the MoU in this regard has been received.
- The skill based programmes will be offered through 1000 centres of MSDE. These centres will become the awareness examination and skilling centres.
- The ITI's and Jan Shiksha Sasthan (JSS) are being identified and will form a part of IGNOU
 network for imparting skill based education.
- ICCR and Central Hindi Directorate will collaborate with IGNOU to provide an awareness programme in Hindi internationally.
- Academic Bank of credit (ABC) portal is gaining importance.
- 2 credit course on 'Ek Bharat Shreshta Bharat' has been developed by IGNOU which is first
 of its kind in the country. Till date around 8,000 students have registered for the programme.
- 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' is being celebrated, where a series of webinars and lectures from eminent personalities are held. Celebrations to commemorate 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' week was organized from 24th February to 15th March 2022.
- An Alumni portal is being developed for more than 36 lakh alumni students. This will be one of the largest IGNOU Alumni global community portal.
- An Awareness Development Programme on National Education Policy-2020 for 15 Lakh University and Co
 clege Teachers is being implemented. Around 10,000 teachers have registered for the programme and the pilot project to train 6, 000 teachers commences from September 9, 2022.

The Planning Board acknowledged the contribution of all the teachers, academics, and staff to the academic growth of the University. The Board appreciated the University for its sincere

efforts towards the development of innovative, skill-oriented academic programmes, effective educational SLM-based videos, and work for the revision of existing academic programmes.

The Chairperson then invited the Member Secretary to start the proceedings. The Member Secretary thereafter presented the agenda items with the permission of the Chair. She informed that this agenda contains the reports related to the new initiatives, confirmation of minutes, action taken reports, Phase forms, reporting and ratification items for various academic programmes and developments taking place in the University.

P.B. 50.1(A) (i)	The Chairperson informed the Planning Board about the University's efforts to implement the NEP 2020. He highlighted various areas where NEP 2020 is being implemented. These are: • The Chairperson informed the Board that the University has moved forward for the nation-wide implementation of NEP 2020. The online programme shall be implemented by all the 56 regional centres of IGNOU in their respective states through three 'S' network (Samarth, SWAYAM and SWAYAMPRABHA. The online programme consists of videos, a discussion forum, virtual conferencing, discussion forum test, and program-end test. • The Board was informed that University Grants Commission (UGC) has notified the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) which was adopted in the 77 th meeting of the Academic Council held on 28 th December 2021. The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) have been implemented in the University so as to facilitate students to choose their learning path to attain a Degree/Diploma /Certificate, working on the principle of multiple entry-multiple exit as well as anytime, anywhere, and anylevel of learning.






	The Popular UG and PG level programmes like MBA, MCA, MA English, MA in Journalism and Mass Communication, MA Rural Development, BCA, B. Com, Bachelor of Social Work, BA (Tourism Studies), Bachelor of Library and Information etc. are also on offer in online mode. The University is already offering programmes through SWAYAM portal. The SWAYAMPRABHA channels also have videos in regional languages.
	• The University has been making extensive use of the Samarth Platform provided by the Ministry of Education for the digitalization of various processes. The University's goal is to implement Student Life Cycle (admission, examination, evaluation, convocation and alumni, etc.) with the Administrative and Finance Modules required for University administration. Presently various operations are being developed and customized and the Admission Portal, Re-registration Portal, Recruitment Portal, Alumni Portal, Capacity Development and Payroll are fully functional on the Samarth Platform.
P.B. 50.1(A) (iii)	 The Board was informed that the courses offered by SWAYAM have been adopted by different educational institutions across the country. As of now 186 programmes are on offer through SWAYAM. SWAYAMPRABHA Channel is being used to provide counseling to the learners in Regional languages as well. Till date over 2000 sessions in different regional languages have been recorded on SWAYAMPRABHA.
P.B. 50.1(A) (iv)	 The Board was informed about various developments at International level. International operations have been extended across the globe through Overseas centres. E-vidyabharti has been initiated to provide online education internationally and till date 1000 learners have enrolled.

The UGC Regulations, 2020 highlight and promote the use OERs for Open & Distance Learning (ODL) mode and focuses on 40% delivery of Self Learning Material (SLM) through OERs. In this context, a committee was constituted for drafting of the Open Educational Resources (OER) policy for the University. "Institutional OER Policy 2020 of IGNOU" was considered in the Academic Council in 78 th meeting held on 13 th June 2022, and it was suggested to


