Monthly Monitoring Report for the month of NOVEMBER 2023

The Regional Services Division (RSD) regularly monitors the activities undertaken by the 57 Regional Centres. The RCs undertake various routine activities throughout the year such as promotional-publicity, admissions, examinations, strengthening of learner support centers, monitoring of learner support centers, conduct of academic counselling sessions and induction meetings. RSD obtains monthly data of all the above stated activities from Regional Centers and compiles them as monthly monitoring reports. In addition, the academics of the RC participate in different research and professional development activities which are also collected and compiled in the MMR.

In the last one-two years, the University has transitioned from the ODL to Online mode of programme delivery for which learner support is provided through a wide range of electronic media and digital platforms by the RCs. Further various schemes of the GOI are implemented by the RCs which are UBA, SBA, EBSB, AKAM, HGT etc. In view of this, the MONTHLY MONITORING REPORT format has been modified from January 2023 in line with new activities including the requirement of NAAC matrices which have been shared by CIQA.

Report on activities: Regional Centers ask to share reports of activity/events like Promotional, Induction, Coordinator meetings, Orientation Programme, Seminar, Extension outreach programme, UBA, ECP, innovation etc with GEOTAG pictures in MS Word format.

1.17 The Monthly Monitoring Report (MMR) for the month of NOVEMBER 2023 has been compiled by the RSD. The MMR has been presented under various subheadings outlining the Academic Activities of Regional Centers and Learner Support Centers. Further, various Finance & Accounts related matters, i.e., expenditures incurred by Regional Centers and Learner Support Centers have been analyzed. The major components of analysis outlined in the reports have been mentioned below:

- 1.) Promotional, Extension, Outreach Activities & Press release: The analysis includes Digital promotional initiatives/activities like use of digital platforms to enhance outreach. Other analyses include the number of press / media publicity releases. Further, the analysis includes meetings/orientation programs through digital platforms for LSC functionaries.
- 2.) Meeting Training & Orientation Programme: In this section, the information about inhouse meetings, meetings with hqrs, capacity building of LSCs functionaries and orientation programme of the academic counsellors are included. In addition, training programme orgnised for academic counselros and students of handling of Learning Management System (LMS) is also included.
- **3.) Strengthening/Establishing LSCs and Exam centres:** This part consists of the opening of new LSC in the region, activation of new programme at the existing study centers, and

empanelment of academic counsellors. Besiudes, establishment of exam centers are included whenever activity carried out.

- **4.) Regional Centres and Learners Support Centres Activities:** The section covers a large number of activities such as induction meetings organised, holding academic counselling sessions for theory and practical courses, project viva-voce held, and assignments submitted and awards transmitted to the hqrs for ODL as well as online programme.
- **5.)** Monitoring of Study Centres & Exam Centers Activities: The section includes participation of regional centers officials during induction meetings, monitoring of counselling sessions held at Learner Support Centers as well as in online mode for ODL and online programme, virtual and physical monitoring of exam centers during the examinations.
- **6.) Student Support Activities**: This part consists of the number of student queries handled, utilization of SMS for communication with students and grievance redressal camps organised by regional centers.
- 7.) Research & Academic Development Activity: This point of analysis encompassed Faculty Development Programme, Webinar/Seminar organized/participated, Radio/TV program etc.
- 8.) Expenditure of Regional Centers (Accounts & Finance): The expenditure incurred for operations of Regional Centers and Learner Support Centers have been analyzed. For the Regional Centre, the points of analysis included Regular Staff Salary, Daily Wage payment, Security, Building Rent, Travel and hiring of taxi, Printing/Publicity, Meeting/workshop/Orientation Programme etc. For the Learner Support Centers, the expenditure was analyzed on the basis of Salary of Part Time functionaries and Counseling, Assignment Evaluation, Practical's etc
- **9.) Staff Strength at Regional Centers:** This part of the report consists of staff strength including academic, non-academic, daily wagers and security personnels posted at regional center.
- **10.) Ratio-Staff, Enrollment, & Expenditure:** Ratio between Staff-enrollment, Staff-expenditure; and Enrollment-expenditure are included.
- 11.) Use of social media: In this section details about the use of various digital and social media by the Regional Centers are included.
- **12.)** Other Events: In addition to the above sections, brief reports on the various events that were held during reporting month were included in the "Other Events" section of MMR.

MMR NOVEMBER 2023 – Executive Summary

The analysis for MMR NOVEMBER 2023 is completely based on the data provided by the Regional Centres. As per the practice, the data for the Monthly Monitoring Report (MMR) was received through a filled-in format as well as through the Google Form. Both were received online. The MMR format which was in used earlier has been modified from NOVEMBER 2023. Some new features have been included in the MMR format.

The data received from 57 Regional Centres have been analysed in this Executive Summary for MMR- NOVEMBER 2023. The analysis has been done under various subheadings for Promotional, extension and outreach activities of the Regional Centres, and Learner Support Centres. Further, various Finance & Accounts related matters, i.e., expenditures incurred by Regional Centres and Learner Support Centres have been analysed. Information related to academic and professional development of the academics of the regional centres has been also compiled and analysed. Immediately following the Executive Summary, data tables pertaining to various activities have been provided. Thereafter, a brief summary of the events held across the country has been provided along with the pictures of those programs.

Promotional, Extension and Outreach Activities

During the month of NOVEMBER 2023, Regional Centres organized various promotional and publicity activities. During this time general publicity initiative/activities to enhance outreach, programme specific publicities, efforts for reaching out to the persons who do not have access to higher education like disadvantaged communities e.g., PH, SC/ST, Women etc have been organised by the Regional Centres.

Summary of general and specific publicity and promotional activities carried out in face-to-face mode and online mode has been given in

Table 1. A total of <u>630</u> such activities have been undertaken across all 57 Regional Centres. The list of top ten regional centres in has been given in **Error! Reference source not found.**












Capacity building and the orientation of part-time functionaries appointed in the learner support centres (LSC) are some of the key activities of regional centres. During the month of NOVEMBER 2023, a total of <u>66</u> such activities were undertaken across the regional centres (Table 21). This category involves meetings and orientation of coordinators and PICs of study centres, training of other part-time functionaries, orientation of academic counsellors and a new item which has been included in the MMR from January 2023 is the training programme organized by regional centres for handling of Learning Management System (LMS). 


During the Corona pandemic, the Learner Support Centres organized this activity virtually. Since all COVID-19 restrictions and prohibitions have been lifted across the country. Face to face and physical activities have been restored to normalcy in the institutions and colleges. Accordingly, some of the LSCs also conducted the IM in face-to-face mode. In addition, induction meetings were also organized separately for the students who had enrolled in an online academic programme. Regional centre-wise details of IM have been given in Table 23. A total 305 induction meetings (IM) were organised during the NOVEMBER 2023 (Table 6), whereas total 103 inductions meetings were organized <u>in face to face for ODL Programme</u>. A total of 129 IMs were organized for students of the ODL program in Online mode during NOVEMBER 2023. The university offers academic programme in two different modes – ONLINE mode and Offline (ODL mode). Hence, the Regional Centres were also asked to provide data for the IM organised for the students enrolled in online programme. The regional centres were organised 73 induction meetings for <u>online academic programme</u>. List of top regional centres who have organised the largest number of IM for the students has been given in **Error! Reference source not found.**.




Monitoring of Study Centres Activities

Monitoring Activities by RCs - Monitoring of functioning of Study Centres is one of the important activities of Regional Centres. Monitoring of academic counselling sessions is an important component of this category. The participation of RCs in the induction meeting (IM) is very important part, as academics from the RCs address the new learners during the **induction meeting**. In the reporting month, out of 273 IM organised (Table 6), a total 133 IM were addressed and attended by the academics of the regional centres, which is 48.72% of the total IM organised during

the month. Top regional centres where the highest number of academics were attended IM have been given in Figure 11. Regional centres-wise status of induction meetings attended, academic counselling sessions visited, visit of exam and entrance exam centres has been provided in Table 27. Data of monitoring of academic activities of the study centres has been summarised in Table 10 and Table 11.



In the month of NOVEMBER 2023, out of the total of 15364 <u>academic counselling</u> sessions were organised (Table 7), 313 academic counselling sessions were monitored by the academics of the regional centres, constitutes 2.03% of the total academic counselling sessions (15364) organised (Table 7). 
were monitored have been given in Figure 12. Regional centres wise number of sessions monitored has been given in the Table 28.

Handling of student queries and **grievances** are crucial for effective student support services. All regional centres answer students' issues face-to-face in person as well as via email, telephone, post, Facebook, and other means (Table 30). Table 30 and Table 31 shows the RC-wise information regarding the handling of the total number of students' queries at each regional centre in the month of NOVEMBER 2023. Across all Regional centres, a total of 245242 queries were handled/addressed, or responded to. The list of top-ten regional centres that attended the maximum number of students' queries is shown in Figure 14. 





<u>Use of SMS</u> is an important mode of communication for the regional centres. It is used to communicate important messages to the learners urgently. For this purpose, Regional Centres use the bulk SMS facilities. During the month of NOVEMBER 2023, a total of 608162 SMS was sent to the students to communicate various types of information to the learners. 
Greivance redressal

Receiving and resolving student grievances is a crucial part of student support services. During the month, regional centres organized online and face to face mode (offline) grievance redressal camps to address students queries and problems related to their studies. In the month of NOVEMBER 2023, all together **76** such camps were held by the regional centres (Table 33). Out of 76, 22 have been organised in face-to-face mode and 54 virtual/online sessions had been hold by the regional centres to resolve students' grievances. The list of top ten regional centres in this category are given in Figure 16.



Research and Academic Development Activities

Regional Centre wise Research and Academic Development activities have been given in Table 40. During the month of NOVEMBER, 2023, Regional Centres reported a total of 118 different Research and Academic Development activities including Faculty Development Programme, Webinar/Seminar organized/participated, Radio/TV program and so on (Table 34). Indeed, the top ten regional centres (Figure 17) reported a total 92 such activities accounting for 77.96% of the total during NOVEMBER 2023.





Expenditure of Regional Centres

This section of the report deals with the expenses of Regional Centres incurred to meet the functioning of Regional Centres during NOVEMBER 2023. The analysis includes the Regional Centre wise total expenditure as well as item-wise expenditures during NOVEMBER 2023. The data is provided in Table 35 to 46. Item-wsie summary of expenses has been given in the Table 13. In NOVEMBER 2023, a total expenditure of Rs. 270714046/- was incurred across the regional centres (Table 13 and Table 35).








Table 36 shows the expenditure incurred on the payment of <u>salaries to regular staff</u> of the regional centres. Percentage of expenditure incurred on the payment of staff salaries at respective regional centres has been given in the corresponding column of the Table 36. 

Expenditure for the arrangement of <u>security</u> is another item of expense at the regional centres. regional centre wise expenditure under this head has been given in Table 38. It shows that a sum of Rs. 6390782/- was spent by all the regional centres, which accounted for 2.36% of total expenditure (Rs. 270714046/-) of all regional centres. Under this category, the top-ten regional centres who spent the highest amount of their total expenditure on security arrangements have been given in **Error! Reference source not found.**. There are Regional Centres which are operational in <u>rented building</u>. Regional Centre wise expenses towards the rent of hiring buildings are given in Table 39 Regional Centre wise expenditure on rent of Regional Centre' Building in NOVEMBER 2023. Analysis of data indicates that a sum of Rs. 6390782/- was spent for paying the rent of buildings by the regional centres, which accounted for 2.36% of total expenditure (Rs. 270714046/-) on regional centres functioning. There are 35 regional centres who reported nil expenditure in this category. Top-ten regional centres who spent the highest amount on building rent are listed in Figure 23.



Expenses on **tours and travel**, and hiring taxis are other items of expenditures of regional centres. In this regard, regional centre wise expenditure incurred during NOVEMBER 2023 is given in Table 40. It shows that Rs. 391841/- was spent to meet the expenses of tours and travels at all the regional centres, which was mere 0.14 % of the total expenditure of Rs. 270714046/- wherein 28 regional centres reported nil expenditure for this item. Figure 24 shows the regional centres with the highest expenditure towards "Travel & Hiring of Taxi".



Next item of analysis is expenditure on <u>meetings, workshops, and orientation</u> programs. Regional Centre wise detailed analysis has been given in Table 41. 



Another item of analysis is expenses on **printing of promotional and publicity items** which has been given in Table 42. It accounted for Rs. 94437173/- across all the Regional Centres, which was 34.88% of the total expenditure of Rs. 270714046/-. Expenditures for Functioning of Learner Support Centres

Expenses on the operations and functions of the Learners Support Centres are an important component of the university's expense. The expenses are made for salaries of part time functionaries (PTFs) of study centres as well as payments for academic counselling sessions, evaluation, and other administrative activities. Expenditures incurred for these activities are given in table 44 to 46.

As far as salaries of part-time functionaries of study centres is concerned, a sum of Rs. 36533214/was spent by all the regional centres during NOVEMBER 2023 which accounted for 13.5% of total expenditure of Rs. 270714046/- incurred across the regional centres (Table 44). Top-ten regional centres who incurred maximum expenses towards payment of salaries for the Part Time Functionaries have been given in **Error! Reference source not found.**. Twenty nine regional centres made nil payment on salaries of part-time functionaries of study centres during NOVEMBER 2023.






Regional Centre wise payments made for counselling and evaluation of assignments are given in Table 45. The regional centres spent Rs. 46391487/- on payment of academic counsellors and for assignments evaluation, which accounted for 17.14% of the total expenditures of Rs. 270714046/. **Error! 
Ratio – Expenditure, Enrolment and Staff

The ratio is defined as the relation between two numbers which shows how much bigger one quantity is than another. In this study the ratio between expenditure and staff, expenditure and enrolment, enrolment and staff has been calculated in order to measure the magnitude of regional centres' expenditure corresponding to staff posted as well as corresponding to the number of learners enrolled.



The higher the **Expenditure-to-Staff ratio**, the greater the expenditure per staff member at the Regional Centre, and *vice-versa*. The highest ratio was found in regional centre Jammu, while the lowest was found in regional centre Itanagar (**Error! Reference source not found.**). Figure 34 and Figure 34 depict the regional centres with the highest and lowest expenditure-to-staff ratio.









### **Bhubaneswar**





The following issues have been updated and discussed extensively during the meeting:








### Report of Webinar on "Vigilance Awareness: A Key to Good Governance"



Keynote Address on "Vigilance Awareness: A Key to Good Governance"




The following points were emphasised by the Regional Director during the meeting:


- The identity of the students to be ascertained so as to avoid any impersonation
