RC 31.12.1	The Member Secretary presented the agenda in detail. The member secretary informed that the need for Institutional Ethics Committee (IECs) in medical and research establishments resulted from the realization that affirms human rights as a prerogative of all members of society. This has been emphasized under the Statement of General Principles in research involving human participants pertaining to precaution and risk minimization.
	Any PhD research involving Human participants require the clearance of IEC prior to commencement of study/research. The Research Unit receives proposals from Disciplines for ethical clearance of research proposals of the Research students involving human subjects, /Animals/flora and fauna. Accordingly, the University laid down the guidelines for Institutional Ethics as a part of the Code of Conduct (approved by RC) wherein cl 16 lays down the provision for an Institutional Ethics Committee (IEC). The Committee constituted by the Competent Authority in its first Meeting discussed various issues pertaining to the ethical clearance of Research proposals including the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) considered essential for the smooth functioning of the IEC.
	The SOP so drafted by the Research Unit along with draft formats for obtaining permission to study on Human Subjects, Animal / Human medical / flora and fauna were circulated amongst

	The Council observed that in view of the widening ambit of the ethical considerations in various areas such as minority and tribal issues etc., the Ethical Committee should be made more representative, drawing more expertise to the domain of the Committee which would be truly mu sectoral in nature.					
RC 31.12.2	The Research Council approved the SOP in principle. However, the RC advised that the SOF be made more comprehensive. While the research proposals being received for ethical clearance should not face any hindrance, at the same time, the committee may include more experts making it multi-sectoral.

	In addition, the University Grants Commission had issued a Public Notice dated 20 th April , 2020 regarding Self-Plagiarism which stipulates the following:					
	(i) Reproduction, in part or whole of one's own previously published work without adequate citation and proper acknowledgment and claiming the most recent work as new and original for any academic advantage amounts to 'text-recycling' (also known as 'self-plagiarism' and is not acceptable.					
	(ii) Text-recycling/self-plagiarism includes:					
	 republishing the same paper already published elsewhere without due and full citation; publishing smaller/exempted work from a longer and previous without due and ful citation in order to show a larger number of publications; 					
	• reusing data already used in a published work, or communicated for publication, in another work without due and full citation;					
	• breaking up a longer/larger study into smaller sections and publishing them as altogethe new work without due and full citation;					
	• paraphrasing one's own previously published work without due and full citation of the original.					
	Accordingly, the Agenda is placed for the approval of the Research Council to insert the above Guidelines of UGC in the Clause 10 of the IGNOU's ' <i>Code of Conduct for Research Students</i> . The approval is also sought for the amendment of Clause 3 of ' <i>Guidelines for Reconciliation of Plagiarism Check</i> ' which is reproduced below:
